623 MANDATORY SUMMER SCHOOL INSTRUCTION

I. PURPOSE

The purpose of this policy is to establish program parameters and student a endance guidelines and requirements for the school district rela ng to the provision of mandatory summer school educa onal services.

II. GENERAL STATEMENT OF POLICY

Summer school educa onal services and instruc on shall be directed toward the fulfillment of the goals and objec ves of the educa onal program and gradua on standards of the school district.

III. PROCEDURES

A. The school district shall offer summer school instruc on providing opportuni es for:

1. Special educa on instruc on and services related to mandatory summer school instruc on consistent with applicable state and federal authority for all qualified disabled children where appropriate to their educa onal needs;

- B. All services of the summer school program will be free to residents of the school district whose need for a summer program has been iden fied by teachers or the school principal and who are required to a end pursuant to established school district criteria and the provisions of this policy.
- C. The summer school curriculum will be established in line with the needs of students and in accordance with rules of the Minnesota Department of Educa on. Remedial, make-up, and review courses shall provide opportuni es for students to qualify for promo on and/or credit in areas and subjects where previous work has not met promo on/credit standards. It shall further be designed to assist students who have not passed one or more basic requirements tests and who are in need of remedia on services rela ng to the school district's gradua on standards or who have been iden fied as at risk of not learning to read before the end of second grade.
- D. Summer school provides the opportunity for students to improve basic skills, further their academic progress, and/or accelerate in designated academic areas. It is the intent of the school district to ensure that courses taught during the summer session are of the same level of instruc onal breadth and difficulty as provided during the regular school year.

IV. MANDATORY SUMMER SCHOOL INSTRUCTION

The school board will direct the administra on to iden fy and develop specific criteria and standards for determining which students must receive summer school instruc on. These will be provided to the school board for review and approval on no less than an annual basis. Following school board approval, the criteria and standards for mandatory summer school instruc on will be included in this policy as A achment A and incorporated herein by reference.

V. TRANSPORTATION SERVICES

- A. The school district shall make available transporta on services for all students required to receive instruc on in the school district's summer school program in accordance with Minnesota Statutes sec on 120A.22, Subd. 5(b). The school district recognizes that transporta on is an essen al part of the school district services to students and parents but further recognizes that transporta on by school bus is a privilege and not a right for an eligible student.
- B. The school board shall retain sole discre on, control and management of scheduling routes, establishment of the loca on of bus stops, manner and method of transporta on, control and discipline of school children, and any other ma er relang to the provision of transporta on services.

VI. SCHOOL BOARD REVIEW

The superintendent or designated representa ve shall report at least annually to the school board regarding the status and u liza on of programs under this policy. All summer school programs will be subject to annual review and approval by the school board.
