Presentations/ Recognitions Twenty Denton ISD students have been chosen out of 1.6 million total entrants to be semi-finalists or commended scholars in the National Merit Scholarship Program for this year's graduating class. The College Board named Joyce Hu, Christian Luevano, Erica Peterson, and Eta-Maru Tako of Guyer High to the distinguished list of National Merit Semi-Finalists. The four join a pool of just 16,000 National Merit Semifinalists in the entire country. High school students are selected into the program based on their top scores on the 2022 Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT).

The Class of 2022 commended scholars include Jonathan Oliver of Denton High: Akintomiwa Akinniyi, Madison Baer, Dylan Davies, Olivia Hodgson, Carter Howard, Joseph Hwang, Sarah Jenkins, Ethan Jones, Ah-Young Kim, Isabella Rohlik, Siddhartha Shah, Gabriella Smith, Aaron Taylor, Jackson Williams, and Ethan Woodman of Guyer High.

The College Board honored 192 Denton ISD high school students with distinctions for 2021, according to their annual list of recipients who are named Advanced Placement Scholars. The national program recognizes individuals who have demonstrated college-level achievement through exceptional scores in AP courses and on AP exams. Students are awarded

based on four levels including: AP Scholar, AP Scholar with Honor, AP Scholar with Distinction and National AP Scholar. Students receive an award certificate from The College Board and although there is no monetary award, this achievement is acknowledged on any score report that is sent to colleges. AP Scholars from Braswell and Denton High schools were recognized during this Board meeting.

The Board recognized the Coats for Kids Ride is the event's founder, Greg Sawko, Sawko & Burroughs Attorney-at-Law along with many other community individuals who helped to make this event possible. Since 2011, the Coats for Kids Ride has collected 19,000 coats for students in Denton ISD and other Denton County school districts. Bringing together motorcycle enthusiasts and community volunteers, this annual event focuses on providing warm coats for students in need, enabling families to focus their priorities on other necessities. The 2021 Coats for Kids Ride recently collected 1,400 coats during its November ride.

For their decade long commitment to the health and safety of our students and the student of Denton County, we wish to express our gratitude and honor the volunteers who conceived and sponsor this annual event.

Public Hearing for Texas Academic Performance Report (TAPR) Dr. Mike Mattingly, Associate Superintendent for Curriculum & Instruction conducted the Public Hearing on the Texas Academic Performance Report (TAPR) 2021 which replaced the AEIS report. The 2021 Accountability Rating was "Not Rated: Declared State of Disaster" (Covid-19). Given the impact of COVID-19, all districts and schools received a label of Not Rated: Declared State of Disaster for their 2021 accountability ratings. Dr. Mattingly gave an overview of student performance for Denton ISD, the class of 2020 had a total of 2096 graduates and the credit for College, Career & Military Readiness (CCMR) credit was 63.1%. The District's graduation rate for 2020 was 97.1%.
