### PROGRAM UPDATES

#### Construction Trades: House Update

- All the tyvec is on the house, the soffit is up and in, and the windows are in. This means that the house is secure for the summer so as to alleviate any vandalism attempts.

#### Cyber Security/Digital Forensics Update

- Several students obtained Microsoft certifications, Net + certification and are going on to Jackson College to finish up. There are 10 seniors going on to further their education and certification completion, and 8 will be continuing in the same field as cybersecurity.

#### Engineering, Drafting & Design Technologies Program

- Mrs. Maxfield piloted Precision Exams the last 1/3 of the school year and has found that it is much more conducive to finding out where students need more instruction, where the curriculum has some “holes” and exactly what students are learning and have mastered. It is a tool we will be using next school year.

#### Criminal Justice Program Update

- Juniors will be seeing a bit different programming this next school year. Mr. Duff is adding forensics to their repertoire so that students will get used to crime scene investigation.

#### Health Science Program Update

- Senior students are still taking their final CNA testing. The skills portion seems to be the one giving them the most trouble, so this will be a bigger portion of next year's instruction.

#### Welding, Brazing & Soldering Program Update

- Seven (7) students obtained full-time jobs upon graduation this year. We have other agreements with area industries to explore more work-based study for our seniors next year.

### GENERAL BUILDING UPDATES

- Governor Snyder, Senator Shirkey and State Representative Leutheuser visited the HACC on Friday, June 8. The visit came about due to an email sent by Mr. Boggs back in February. The email stressed the need for more technology programs for high school and even for K-12 in order to prepare our students for the high need in tech starting this year. Since the Governor was going to be in town for another event, he scheduled a 1/2 hour visit with us while he was here. It was wonderful that the Senator and the State Rep were also able to come by to see Mr. Boggs' captivating presentation. It truly was a feather in the cap of both the HACC and the HCISD to have him here and interested in our technology programs. Brooke was also able to

talk to Senator Shirkey and will be having him back in the fall to possibly do some work with the students pertaining to the company he owns in Jackson. He was also excited about the program and the exemplar it is becoming in the state.
