



— San Antonio are eligible for this agreement


Districts can convert existing schools to the partnership and take advantage of the combined efforts between the district and the partner to advance the outcomes for students.




Benefits in SB 1882 Legislation

Financial Benefit

- All SB 1882 partnerships are eligible to potentially receive additional state funding.
- SSAISD would receive 8.2% of the SB 1882 funding and A&M-SA would receive 91.8%
- Current funding amounts haven't been released yet for 2020/2021.








SB 1882 Process

ISD and Board develop and authorize SubChapter 3 Charter School



We have three departments in the COEHD: the Department of Curriculum and Instruction, the Department of Educator and Leadership Preparation, and the Department of Counseling, Health, and Kinesiology.




We also have our Education Preparation Program (EPP) which oversees our teacher candidate field placements, clinical teaching experience, and teacher certification.

The College of Education and Human Development

- Dual Credit Partner We will use part of the SB 1882 funding to underwrite dual credit fees and to provide adjunct professors on site for teaching dual credit
- Faculty in Residence Assign a professor to each SB 1882 site to support teacher development and to help advance student outcomes
- Clinical Teacher Placements— We will provide funding to A&M-SA students to conduct year-long clinical teaching placements for our SB 1882 partnerships. This provides a more consistent model for students
- Graduate Education for Teachers – We will use a portion of the SB 1882 funds to provide scholarships for teachers to pursue master's degrees.

The College of Education and Human Development

- Mental Health
 — Our Mental
 Health Counseling Graduate
 Program will help to provide
 support services for students
 in partner campuses.
- Applied Behavior Analysis the College of Education and Human Development is in process of developing an ABA program and will work with districts to provide training and educational opportunities
- First Year Teacher Support Our wrap around model will be focused on first year teacher support and efforts to improve teacher retention.
- Research Our faculty members will work with each partner campus to develop action research projects focused on improved campus functioning



The College of Education and Human Development

- Teacher Incubation we will be able to work with the ISD to incubate teachers and to help them develop on our partner campuses.
- Co-Located Academic Advisors— A&M-SA will work with each districts to identify co-located advisors aimed at improving the college pipeline.
- Curriculum Development
 Our faculty experts will lend support to curriculum development processes for each partner campus
- Improved Student Outcomes— Our primary focus will be on the improvement of student outcomes through a collaborative partnership with the ISD.
