7th Grade: Natellie Boone


"Natallie has a great attitude. She is a hard worker and helps out wherever she can. She's just a model Railroader, always striving to do her best."

III. State Testing:

- April is a short month of school with only 16 school days. Students are most likely to be absent on Mondays and Fridays and these days are not ideal for testing at the middle school level. We are completing state testing most Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays that we have school in April. We should have all of our testing completed by April 25th, with only some make-up M-Step tests left to complete. Students will take our district level standardized tests, NWEA, in May. These tests are much more simple and less time consuming to administer.
- At the middle school level, the following state standardized tests are required:
 - > 6th grade: M-STEP (Mathematics and English Language Arts)
 - > 7th grade: M-STEP (Mathematics and English Language Arts)
 - Sth grade: M-STEP (Science and Social Studies), P-SAT 8 (Mathematics and Reading)
- Students will be rewarded for their hard work on these tests, and we also hold some fun competitions between grade levels to see which grade improves the most! We do our best to reduce stress and make this month as enjoyable as possible for the students.

- Creating a testing schedule that includes all of the necessary components of a testing day such as making sure the school and adjacent classrooms to testing are as disruption free as possible, covering all teachers for the preparation periods, and ensuring all students who have testing accommodations get what they need to be successful is a daunting task.
