

FPC Allen Campus Board Report January 2026

- Several Allen Campus team members hosted a booth at the Trade School Fair in Spearman on November 19th. We had the opportunity to share opportunities at FPC with high school students from Hansford, Hemphill, Lipscomb, Ochiltree & Sherman counties. This event centered around exposing students to future career paths, not jobs, but pathways to better themselves while residing in our small panhandle communities.
- Our eight Phlebotomy students completed class in December and were able to test for their licensure.
- We were able to get new carpet installed in our stadium classroom at the Allen Campus over the Christmas holiday. We are very thankful to have this much-needed improvement completed!
- Cassi Laxton and Karen Metzger have been meeting with the ISDs on the northwest side of the region about the possibility of helping them through the creation of a Rural Pathway Excellence Partnership Program (R-PEP). The schools interested include Follett, Darrouzett, Canadian, Booker, and Perryton. The Rural Pathway Excellence Partnerships (R-PEP) program allows rural school districts to enter into agreements with other school districts to develop rural college and career pathway partnerships. The goal of the R-PEP program is to increase access to high-quality post-secondary pathways for rural students through multi-district collaboration. At present this collaboration would focus on pathways in Information Technology and Diesel Mechanics.
- The CDL Department completed a preliminary training audit with the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration on December 9th in Borger. Representatives from all campuses met with the auditor to complete the audit. We have not received follow up from them yet.
- The Perryton Workforce Development Center was featured as part of the Leadership Perryton Education tour in January. We were able to share with the community the great things that happen in diesel, welding, and CDL at that facility as well as tour them through those areas of the campus.
- The new CDL skill training/test pad was inspected by representatives from the state of Texas on January 13th. New routes and the new skills training/test pad should be fully approved for use by the beginning of February.
