Denton Independent School District TWU Dual Credit Partnership Memorandum of Understanding

SUMMARY:

This item requests approval of the dual credit partnership agreement between Texas Woman's University and Denton ISD.

BOARD VALUE:

PREVIOUS BOARD ACTION:

The Denton ISD Board of Trustees has approved prior year MOUs outlining a dual credit partnership with TWU.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board defines dual credit as a process by which a high school student enrolls in a college course and receives simultaneous credit for the course from both the college and the high school. The credit earned in these courses is counted for both high school and college credit. Dual credit courses may be taught on the high school campus by an approved instructor, or a high school student may take a dual credit course on the college campus. Dual credit courses include both academic courses as well as CTE courses.

In Denton ISD, the dual credit program is a cooperative program between the Denton Independent School District and three partners- Texas Woman's University (TWU), the University of North Texas (UNT), and North Central Texas College (NCTC).

The partnership agreement with TWU, presented here, includes instruction on the home campus with a Denton ISD teacher who meets TWU adjunct requirements.
