Response to COVID-19 (describe your school's overall experience with the COVID-19 crisis, and how it affected your school this year):

Our school began developing a "Return to School" plan in late June with a district committee made up of staff in many roles. The plan had mitigation protocols and practices in place for every location and aspect of our schools from transportation, buildings, pupil services, staffing, and learning environments. We also offered 3 learning options for our families: In-person, Remote, and Virtual. The first two options were taught by our own staff and the third was through an online learning system with teachers outside of our district. The remote option has also been used in the case of Covid-19 Quarantining. It has been the best option for our students and families, but has put extra responsibilities, hours of instruction, and increased efforts to make sure our students at home are staying with those in person. Mental

health of both students, teachers, and families has been a huge focus this year. We have only gone "All Remote" for a 3 week period between Thanksgiving and Christmas due to a staff shortage throughout the district. During this time, staff remained at the buildings and several groups of students were allowed to remain at school as long as they had certain criteria met.

- Coaching is done by teaching staff at grade level meetings, Marilyn Heifner, Dee Thompson and/or Holly Sweeney.
 *PD has been offered including Math network and CESA 11 opportunities, ELA standards Rollouts, and reading networks. We have also made schedule changes for next year to allow for an interventionist to be an instructional coach on Fridays as her schedule allows.
 - Most objectives are for the end of the school year.
