 Our vision is to strengthen and enhance downtown Blytheville as the economic and social focal point of our community based on the strong foundation of our past.
- What service(s) does the non-profit/community organization provide?
 Downtown Main Street provides many opportunities and events for the community to take part in. It hosts the annual Chili Cook-off, Springtime on the Mall, Lights of the Delta, and a host of many other events that provide community members a safe place to congregate. Many of these events serve as fundraisers for many events around our city. Downtown Main Street helps local businesses and property owners with beautification projects, development, and preservations efforts.

Students will contact architects and designers at the state level for approval of designs in regards to the Historic Commission's standards. They will

conduct meetings, understand local political structure, and collaborate with community partners.

- What are the non-profit/community organization procedures and policies to ensure the safety of student volunteers?
 Downtown Main Street will provide access through owner consent and direction to the properties identified as well as help us develop and understand the plan for cleanup. We will provide a certified employee of the school to accommodate students with a 1-10 ratio. Gloves and safety goggles will be provided during the cleanup process and students will receive training for safety procedures and precautions. During the development of the renovation plans, Downtown Main Street will provide guidance to ensure students are following guidelines and standards for historic preservation requirements.
