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4 Policy Name: *District Safety* 5 Regulation ------

Policy #8301

For purposes of this policy, "disaster means the occurrence or imminent threat of damage, injury, or loss of life or property".

The Board recognizes that safety and health standards should be incorporated into all aspects of the operation of the District. Rules for safety and prevention of accidents will be posted in compliance with Montana Safety Culture Act and the Montana Safety Act. Injuries and accidents will be reported to the District office.

The board of trustees has identified the following local hazards that exist within the boundaries of its school district: [Fire, Earthquake, Avalanche, High Winds, Tornadoes, Intruders, Firearms, etc.]

The District Emergency Coordinator and building principal will develop and regularly update a district emergency plan that will include procedures for identified hazards. This plan and procedures will be discussed and distributed to each staff member at the beginning of each school year. There will be at least eight (8) disaster drills per year, four (4) of which will be fire drills. All teachers will shall discuss fire safety drill procedures, and lockdown and evacuation procedures with their class at the beginning of each year and will have evacuation routes posted in a conspicuous place next to the exit door. The drills will be held at different hours of the day or evening. A record will be kept of all drills.

The trustees shall review the school safety or emergency operations plan periodically and update the plan as determined necessary by the trustees based on changing circumstances pertaining to school safety. Once the trustees have made the certification to the office of public instruction, the trustees may transfer funds pursuant to Section 2, 20-1-401, MCA to make improvements to school safety and security.

The Superintendent will develop safety and health standards which comply with the Montana Safety Culture Act. **Optional:** The Superintendent shall ensure District employees are provided equipment, tools, and devices designed to ensure a safe and health workplace in accordance with this policy. Failure to use the provided equipment in a suitable or timely manner may be considered a violation of District policy. If a staff member requires equipment that is not available, an employee may submit a request to the administration in accordance with established District practice.

Extra-curricular emergency procedures will be distributed to all coaches and staff involved in after hour supervision.
