Open Enrollment Season is February 5 - April 30

Open enrollment information may be found on the Unity School District website at www.unity.k12.wi.us or at the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction website at http://dpi.wi.gov/open-enrollment. If you would like further information, you can contact the Unity School District office at 715-825-3515.

What is Public School Open Enrollment?

Wisconsin's inter-district public school open enrollment program allows parents to apply for their children to attend school districts other than the one in which they reside. Applications may be submitted to up to three nonresident school districts.

Who may participate in open enrollment?

Pupils in 5-year-old kindergarten to grade 12 may apply to participate in open enrollment.

Open enrollment for prekindergarten, 4-year-old kindergarten and early childhood education is limited. Parents should call their resident school districts to find out if their preschoolaged children qualify for open enrollment.

How and when may parents apply?

The open enrollment application period for the 2018-19 school year is from February 5-April 30, 2018. The application period closes at 4:00 p.m. on April 30, 2018. Late applications will not be accepted for any reason.

Unity Summer School Planning

The 2018 Summer School Program looks to build on the success of the last two summers' programs. Enrollment numbers for last summer were absolutely amazing, with over 600 enrolled. Luck and Unity, working collaboratively, provided the area's richest, most rigorous, and creative summer school programming. This year's program will again see the two neighboring districts combining to provide an exemplary learning program for students. The courses offered will be geared toward students' interests while providing a project based approach to learning.

Families and students who are interested in registering for the course offerings at the elementary, middle, and high schools are encouraged to contact their child's office soon. Information will be posted on the school district website regarding the exact dates, times, events, and classes.

School Safety Focus

School safety is the primary focus of any school system. In light of recent events, the topic has become even more of a concern. Unity School District has a comprehensive safety plan that has been developed by the District crisis team, with Polk County Sheriff's Department oversight, based upon the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) guidelines. This plan is constantly being evaluated and has been recently reviewed.

Unity School District employs the ALICE program in its School Safety Plan. ALICE training is designed to provide comprehensive preparedness in the event of a violent (armed) intruder. The goal is to utilize infrastructure, technology, and human action to increase overall student and staff safety and survival chances. ALICE stands for ALERT, LOCKDOWN, INFORM, COUNTER, EVACUATE. All school employees have been trained in the ALICE response model, with several staff members certified as trainers. Unity's school resource officer, a Polk County Deputy Sheriff, coordinates the training of the staff and students.

Unity will conduct two safety drills this spring, in accordance with state statute. Schools are required to complete two safety drills annually. More information will be shared with parents prior to the drills at the school to ensure that parents have an opportunity to visit with their child(ren).

Unity Hosts Summer Regional Custodial Workshop

The CESA #11 Custodial Workshop and Vendor Showcase will be hosted at Unity on July 11, 2018. At past workshops, there have been about 150 custodians from CESA #11 schools and ten vendors. In addition to the vendor showcase, there will be several educational topics offered for the custodians.

This workshop is designed to highlight the latest innovations in custodial/maintenance products/ practice and to increase awareness of issues in the workplace affecting staff and students. Session topics may include school safety, cleaning efficiency, lawn and turf maintenance, LED lighting, and new maintenance technologies. This workshop will also offer an opportunity to tour the new Unity High School.
