- Continue to work on bullying issue
- Firearms training
- Provide Mental Health Awareness training for all teachers
- Armed Public Safety Officer
- Keeping all "side" doors locked at all times and stricter "visitor" control
- Locked Buzz-in doors
- Locked doors at all times
- New fencing by old gym
- Code to get into the school like at ABC Daycare
- Parents purchasing classroom supplies (freeing up funds for SRO)
- Doors need to be locked/pay more attention who walks through door
- Secured playgrounds and secured entry
- Metal detector at all entrances
- Have drills to prepare for shooting (without scaring the children)
- Random visits from Yamhill County Officer
- Crisis training seminar for staff
- Keep track of students
- Parent Drop Off – not old gym
- Practice lockdown drills
- Recess staff need radios
- More security cameras
- Take report or complaints more seriously
- Guards at all entrance
- Greeter /Volunteer in the lobby area to direct all people coming into school
- Surveillance cameras in all major entrances
- More teacher supervision

- Dress code
- Volunteer crosswalk personnel
- Windows in every room from fast escape
- Allow volunteers to work at school on-site, ready to confront a threat immediately
- Move the sign-in table to a better visible spot for the office staff
- SRO staged out front and locked buzz-in front doors. These two things make me feel safe “knowing” that nobody could make their way I to create a harmful environment for both staff & children

- Staff training on specific protocol
- Enforce the safety measures and rules you have in place-do drills to practice what to do- do not ignore bulling
- Keep SRO position and add more surveillance cameras, lock front doors and classrooms and add fencing
- Who is responsible for who comes in and what are the criteria for allowing or denying admittance
