FROM THE DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT

Dear Parents and Community Members,

The Oregon Department of Education's State Report Card will not reflect overall ratings this year for school districts and schools due to the recent passage of Every Student Succeeds Act (ESAA). However, each school received ratings from 1-5 for the following performance indicators: Academic Achievement, Academic Growth, Student Group Growth, Graduation, and Student Group Graduation. Some of the highlights from Neah-Kah-Nie School District's State Report Card include the following:

- · 99.5% of all teachers are highly qualified
- Average class sizes at all NKN schools are lower than the state average
- · Fortunately, due to Neah-Kah-Nie's unique funding formula of property taxes and Tillamook State Timber revenue, NKN School District's per pupil spending is higher than the state average. This is why your children's class sizes are smaller, there is art and music education preschool-grade 12, extra-curricular offerings at the secondary level, school counselors at each school, Family Resource Coordinators, instructional technology, etc.
- NKN High School earned Level 5 in all performance indicators (Academic Growth, Student Group Growth, Graduation, and Student Group Graduation) and earned a Level 4 in Academic Achievement
- \cdot 86.4% of NKN High School 11th graders met or exceeded the state benchmark in English Language Arts
- \cdot 97.3% of all students in the four year cohort at NKN High School graduated and 83.7% of the five year cohort graduated. 100% of economically disadvantaged students in the four-year cohort graduated

- \cdot Neah-Kah-Nie Middle School earned all Level 4 and 5 in Academic Achievement, Academic Growth, and Student Group Growth
- · Garibaldi Elementary earned Level 4 in Academic Growth and Level 3 in Academic Achievement & Student Group Growth
- · Nehalem Elementary earned Level 4 in Academic Achievement and Level 3 in Academic Growth & Student Group Growth
- · All Neah-Kah-Nie schools met the state benchmark in student participation rate for the statewide assessments in English Language Arts and math

The state report card includes many celebrations; however, there are many areas where students can perform at a higher level. This is why elementary schools are implementing Response to Instruction & Intervention (RtI), textbook adoptions are current in all core subject areas, staff receive extensive professional development during late start Wednesdays, there are established data teams in place at each school, preschool is a district priority, Site Councils write innovative School Improvement Plans, the district's improvement plan is aligned with School Improvement Plans, a long-range plan is currently being written, and irregular student attendance is a high priority. Not represented in the report card is the district's commitment to physical fitness, music and art education, technology instruction, extra-curricular opportunities, and the emotional well being of all students. Neah-Kah-Nie High School's mission is to provide a learning community focused on improvement, persistence and integrity. Because this is the first report card being issued that includes the new "smarter balanced assessment scores" there is no comparative data and therefore many sections of the report card will show no ranking. In reading, writing, mathematics and science, NKN students outperformed state averages. We continue to enjoy a positive growth trend in the other measures of success as well.

On the third page you will find results from the new language arts and math tests and page 4 talks about academic growth. We are proud of our performance in writing which reflects high level growth that we feel is the result of sustained focus. Our intent is to continue our literacy work across all content areas in order to sustain our positive trajectory, while we intensify efforts to address student's attendance, study skills and math instruction, an area that we showed good growth in but need to continue to build on.

Because we are focused on continual growth, we regularly collect data on every student at every grade level which helps us determine instructional needs and student supports. This year will be our second year using the SMcIAP schoolwide math assessments, Cornell Notes to support strong writing, and having teacher collaboration and professional learning during late start Wednesdays.

Learning is hard work. It is our job to provide excellent, effective instruction that results in improved student learning. Teachers are expected to present rigorous materials that demand high levels of thinking and responses from students every day. It is the student's job to attend

every day, participate, be engaged, advocate for themselves, and give their best effort to learn in a safe, responsible and respectful manner. Students should not expect their teachers to make things easy, rather they should expect them to make things interesting. We hope students will be brave and adventurous learners, to build their capacity to achieve at a high levels and to increase their resilience and ability to adapt to make the most of their school experiences.

As parents or mentors in the community, you can help us improve student effort and achievement in four important ways:

- . Make sure your student has excellent attendance.
- 2. Review and monitor your student's academic progress by accessing our on-line parent assist program. We encourage you to do this weekly.
- Be a persistent and proactive communicator- call right away if you have questions, ideas or concerns. We will do the same.
- Encourage students to set goals, plan for the future and develop a support network that will expand their horizons and help them achieve their goals.


