Behavior

There were 163 referrals written for the month of October. One of those referrals resulted in an out-of-school suspension. We are still working with behavior on the bus but have been scheduling meetings with families to address persistent behaviors. We continue to have a high number of referrals around overuse of passes and tardies. Mrs. Kollross and myself are working with our staff and students to find ways to reduce the referrals in this area. We expect to see a decrease in the months to come.

Parent Teacher Conferences

We held parent teacher conferences from 3:30 until 6:45 on Thursday November 2, and Tuesday, November 7. This year, our junior high staff tried something new. They created a document for families to sign up for a conference and then sent a link out to families. Additionally, they met as a team with most of the families that signed up for a conference. Our teachers had almost every slot filled up and some met with families outside of these days to accommodate families. On the intermediate side, teachers were able to have a conference inperson or on the phone with nearly every family. This is a great opportunity for teachers and families to connect about student learning and growth.

Book Fair/Fall Festival

In an effort to leverage the presence of many of our families coming to the school during parentteacher conferences, Mrs. Beaman and her team of staff organized a Scholastic Book Fair and Fall Festival. Additionally, Mrs. Beaman and Ms. Wilcoxen opened it up for students during the week. The committee also planned activities for students and families, such as reading to a therapy dog, crafting projects, family fall photos, and games. Classes also decorated a pumpkin after their favorite book or character for a contest. In all, it was great to have so many families come together at the school.
