Gifted & Talented/EXPO Update

Chris Shade, Lori Mabry, and Melissa Matthews spotlighted different pieces of the EXPO program to help explain the current status of the EXPO population within Denton ISD. According to the National Association for Gifted Children (NAGC), while "giftedness is represented through all racial, ethnic, income levels, and exceptionality groups," "underrepresentation is widely spread. It's estimated that African American, Hispanic American, and Native American students are underrepresented by at least 50% in programs for the gifted." As the nation becomes more and more diverse, gifted education programs should reflect changing U.S. demographics. Equitably identified gifted students represent cultural and linguistic diversity as well as a wide range of socioeconomic groups and geographic areas, yet these populations are too often overlooked. Reversing the underrepresentation of culturally and linguistically diverse students (CLD) in gifted education will require that educators have a thorough understanding of the reasons that CLD students have traditionally been excluded from participation in gifted programs. In order to prove and/or improve the quality of assessment profiles, EXPO specialists began auditing student profiles to ensure accuracy. Every campus is audited twice a year by auditors and once a year by an EXPO partner. Through this process, a need for more effective method to track student participants was uncovered and the EXPO Data Dashboard was created.

Potential Bond Refunding Opportunity Bill Gumbert, BOSC discussed the savings opportunity for the District by refunding existing Unlimited Tax Refunding Bonds, Series 2006 and 2009 and Unlimited Tax School Building Bonds, Series 2007 and 2008. Assuming current rates of interest prevail at the time of the refunding, the total debt service saving are projected to be \$44,487,925.

Construction Report

Garry Ryan with Balfour Beatty presented the construction update on Braswell High School. Administration/Library, cafeteria and kitchen as well as the classroom wings roofing is complete. The fine arts area will be the last element to be completed. The construction progress through January is 69% complete.

Catherine Bell Elementary (#23) is 100% dried in with the roofing at 75% completion. The concrete fire lane paving is complete except the street entrances. All of the geothermal wells have been drilled and the retaining wall along the creek is 90% complete. Structural steel beams at the main entrance are complete and the stonework at the main entrance is being installed. The parking lots are 100% complete.

4<sup>th</sup> Quarter Growth Report Rocky Gardner, Templeton Demographics presented the District's 4<sup>th</sup> quarter growth report. The DFW area had a 2.9% increase in job growth with 26,480 housing starts as of December 2015. Denton ranks 2<sup>nd</sup> in house closings behind Frisco ISD. Of the Top 10 Subdivisions, four of them are on the 380 corridor. Bell, Cross Oaks and Savannah elementary zones have the most new home activity, accounting for 44.8% of all DISD starts in 2015. Denton ISD will reach over 28,000 in student enrollment next fall and over 30,000 in the fall of 2019.
