## Update for Oregon School Partners September 2024

#### 2024 Summer EBT Application Closure Date Extended to Sept. 30, 2024

Since June 28, 2024, Oregon's Summer EBT program has issued benefits to over 343,000 children, which totals more than \$41 million dollars in grocery benefits for families this summer! Summer EBT provides supplemental grocery benefits for families with eligible children in the household, issued onto an Oregon EBT card to help support families with the additional cost of food when school is out for the summer.

The 2024 Summer EBT application period was originally scheduled to end on Monday, Sept. 2, 2024, however, the USDA's Food and Nutrition Service programs invited states to request a deadline extension until Sept. 30, 2024. Oregon applied for this extension, and it was approved last week! Learn more about the extension through our <u>news release</u>.

This extension gives more time to reach families who may have been missed earlier this summer given that Summer EBT wasn't fully operational until Oregon schools were already released for summer break. We believe these efforts will significantly increase awareness and participation in the Summer EBT program, ensuring that as many eligible families as possible may benefit from this critical assistance.

Families who did not automatically receive benefits this summer, especially those with children who were enrolled in a school during the 2023-2024 school year that was participating in the National School Lunch or Breakfast Programs, should still apply to determine eligibility. Applications can be found online and for download in 10 languages at <u>sebt.oregon.gov</u>.

## Student Illness and Absence

#### Call or Email the Main Office to Let Us Know

It is important to let us know that your child will not be attending so we do not worry about them. If your child is not at school, and we haven't heard from you, then you will receive an automated phone call notifying you of your child's absence.'

#### How long does my child need to wait to return to school after an illness?

The answer to this question depends on their symptoms. Our school has to follow the directives from the Oregon Health Authority (OHA) regarding when students may be readmitted to school after an illness. Please review the provided info from OHA. **Please also note that the period of exclusion often requires 24 hours away from school** (this is not a rule that the school developed, but one we have to follow).

#### PLEASE KEEP STUDENTS WITH SYMPTOMS OUT OF SCHOOL

This list is school instructions, not medical advice. Please contact your health care provider with health concerns. SYMPTOMS OF ILLNESS THE STUDENT MAY RETURN AFTER. \*The list below tells the shortest time to stay home A student may need to stay home longer for some illnesses. Fever: temperature of 100.4°F \*Fever-free for 24 hours without taking fever-reducing (38°C) or greater medicine. \* Symptoms improving for 24 hours (no cough or cough New cough illness is well-controlled). New difficulty breathing \* Symptoms improving for 24 hours (breathing comfortably). Urgent medical care may be needed. Diarrhea: 3 loose or watery \*Symptoms improving for 24 hours (no more than stools in a day OR not able to two bowel movements more than normal and no control bowel movements longer having accidents) OR with orders from doctor to school nurse. \*Symptom-free for 24 hours OR with orders from Vomiting: one or more episode that is unexplained doctor to school nurse. Headache with stiff neck and \*Symptom-free OR with orders from doctor to school nurse. Follow fever instructions above. Urgent feve medical care may be needed. Skin rash or open sores \*Symptom free, which means rash is gone OR sores are dry or can be completely covered by a bandage OR with orders from doctor to school nurse. \*Symptom-free, which means redness and drainage are Red eyes with colored drainage gone OR with orders from doctor to school nurse. Jaundice: new yellow color in eyes or skin \*After the school has orders from doctor or local public health authority to school nurse Acting differently without a reason: \*Symptom-free, which means return to normal unusually sleepy, grumpy, or confused. behavior OR with orders from doctor to school nurse. Major health event, like an illness lasting 2 \*After the school has orders from doctor to school or more weeks OR a hospital stay, OR nurse AND after measures are in place for the student's safety. 
## Medication

All prescription and over-the-counter (OTC) medication must be administered at the office by trained personnel.


Medication that you want your child to take during the school day has to be brought to the office in the original container (or we cannot take possession of the medication). Parents must complete the medicine administration form before trained personnel can dispense medication to a child. ALL OTC medications must be handled through the office (this includes cough drops).
