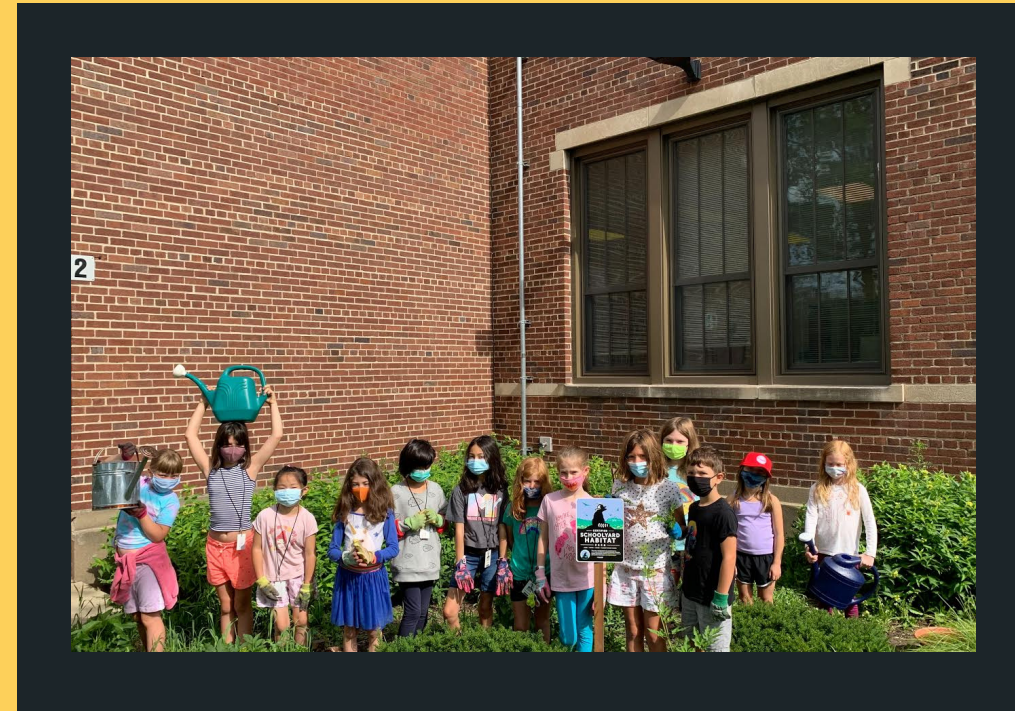

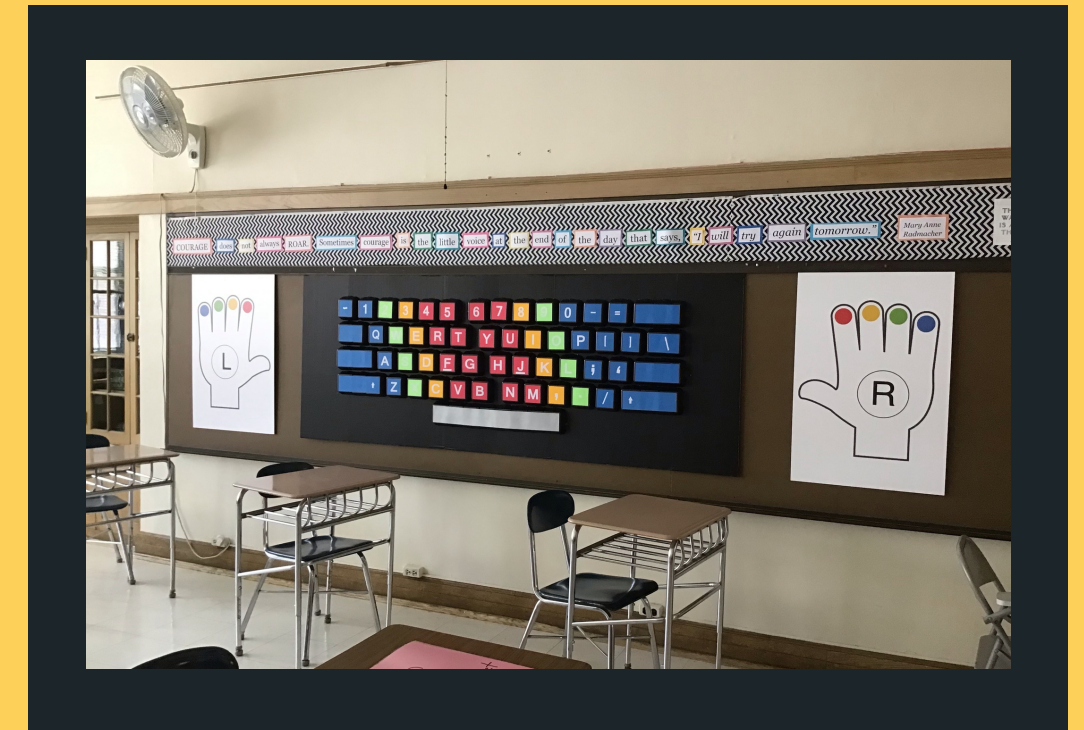

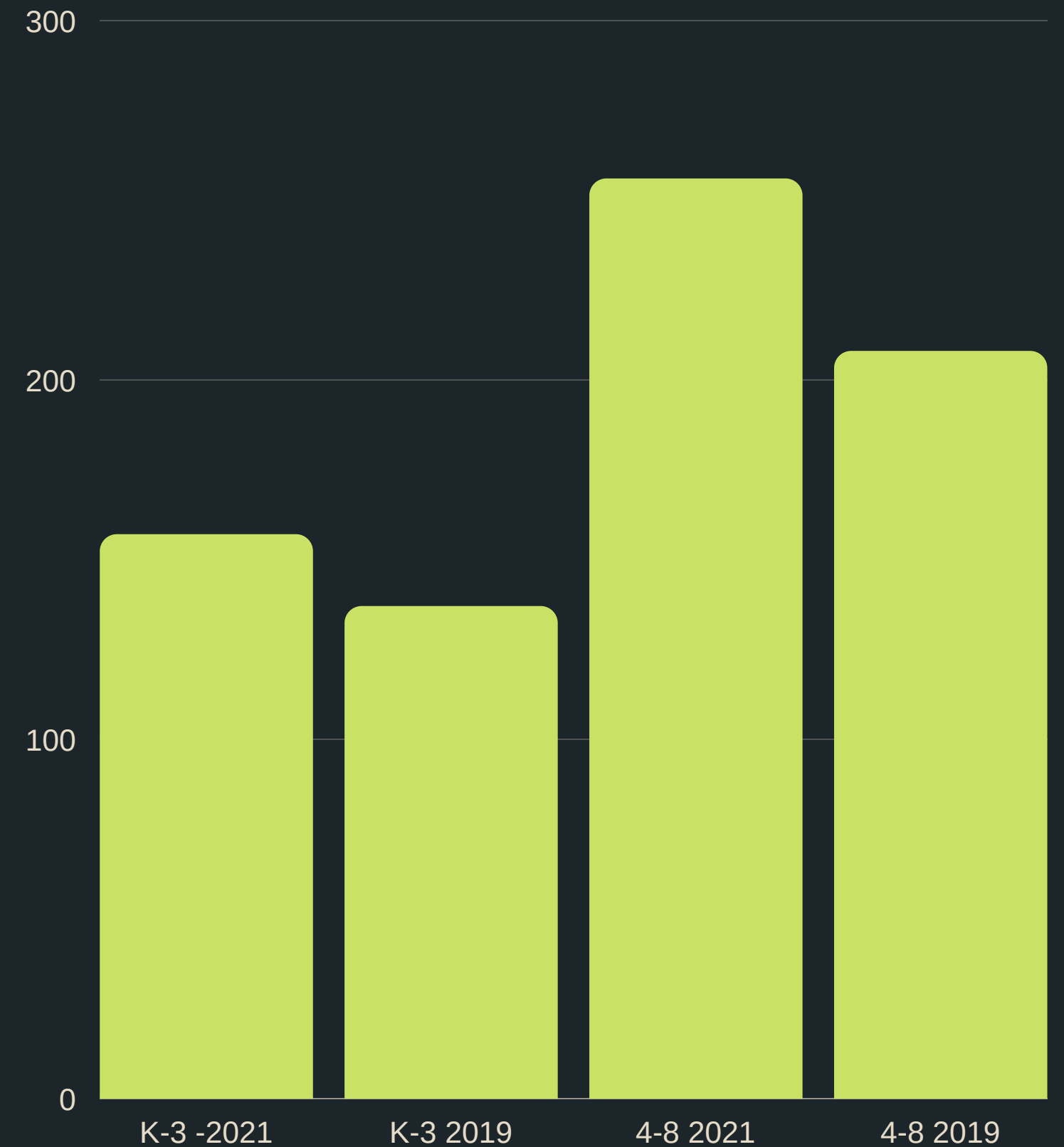

ATTENDANCE GROWTH

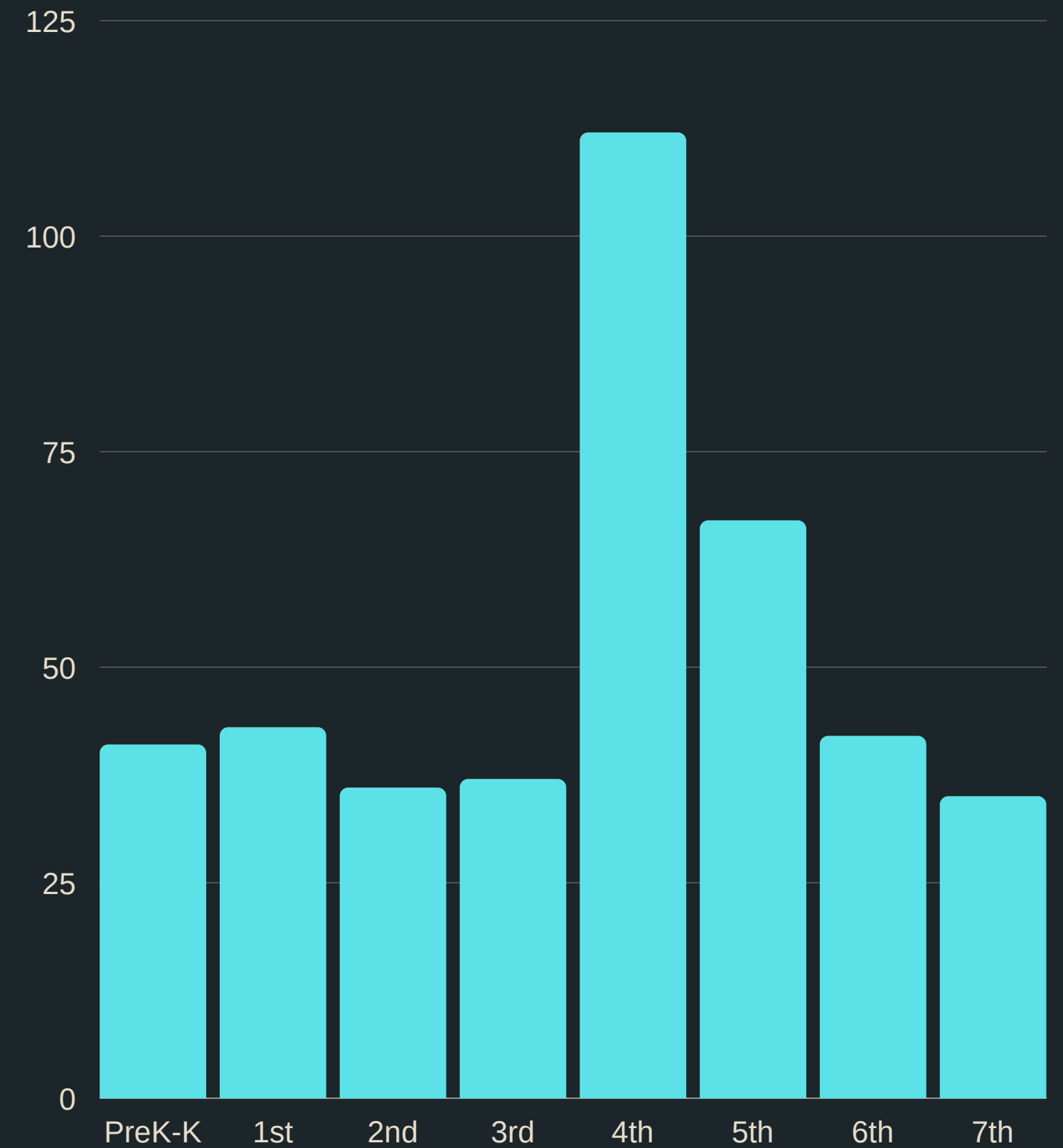
2021 VS 2019

-Students who received speech services: 29

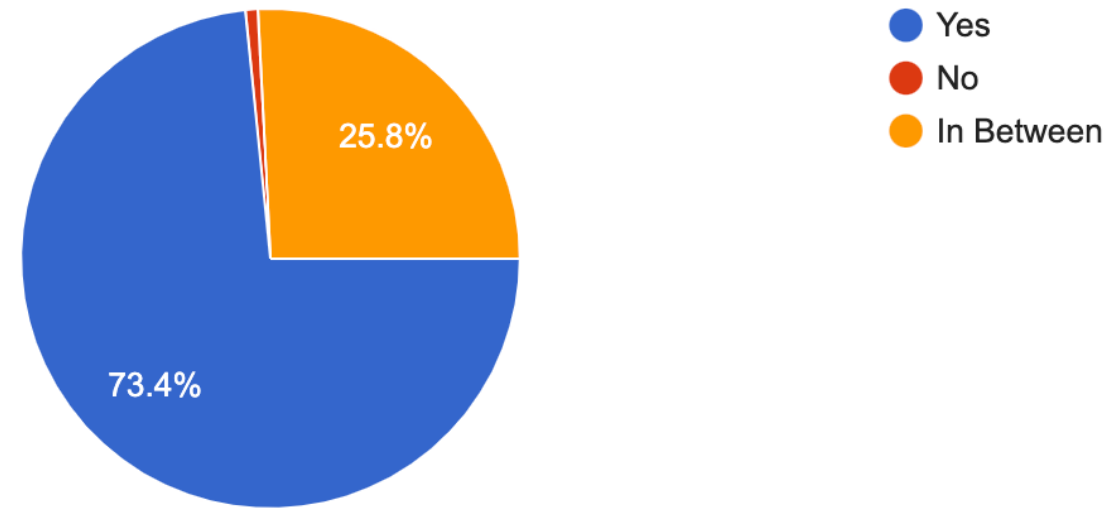

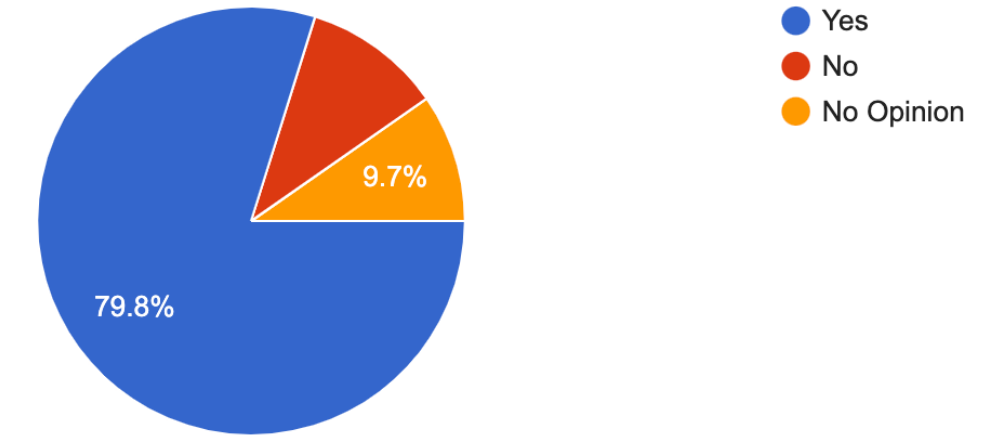
Did your student speak positively about the D90 summer school program?

This is the first year that D90 Summer School offered academic classes as part of our summer school programs. Would you like to see summer school classes offered in the future?

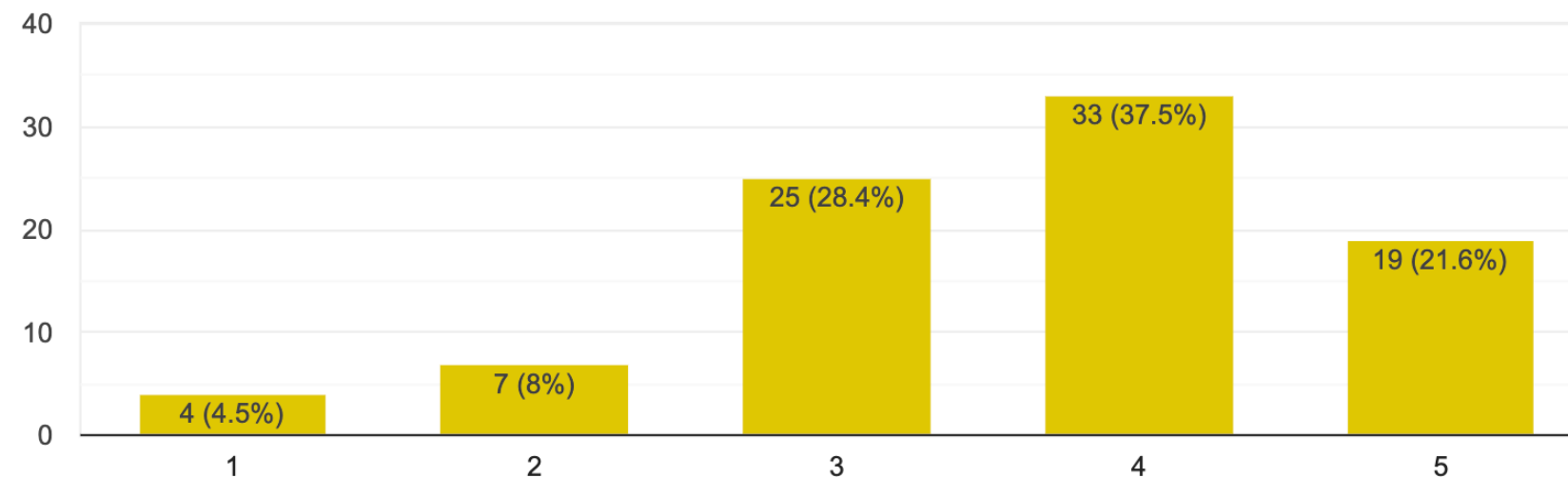

Recommendations for the future

FROM PARENTS

- enrollment program is cumbersome to use
- more consistent communication from teachers about student progress
- increased communication about enrollment process in summer school from district

FROM TEACHERS

- look for opportunities to group ESY students with more flexibility
- continue to provide tech support prior to summer school
- continue to provide classroom aides

FROM SUMMER SCHOOL LEADERS

- keep all summer school classes at one location
- continue to utilize a waitlist
- tighten registration deadlines and adhere to them
