RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING DATES FOR FILING AFFIDAVITS OF CANDIDACY

A. Restraint and Seclusion Rules, Joy Kieffer

Minnesota law was passed in 2009 with an implementation date of August 1, 2011. District policy is not necessary since Federal laws are in place. These procedures are used in response to a treatment failure that results in an individual's loss of control. Parent notification of use of a restrictive procedure is required. Staff training is provided.

Discussion – How is this handled in an EBD classroom where there is more likelihood of restraint being used. This is what will need attention since there is a requirement that a report be filed if 2 incidents occur within 30 days.

Is there discussion at the state level regarding availability of placement facilities for students who are not successful in the public school setting due to their behavior issues.

B. End-of-Year Department Goals – Finance, Gary Kawlewski
Completed four out of five goals: reduce workers comp experience, increase VEBA participation, develop 5-year levy plan, and implement additional paperless procedures. Did not meet goal of increasing investment earnings due to low interest rates and current economic situation.
