Our Mission at Cabot Panther Academy is to reimagine education by...

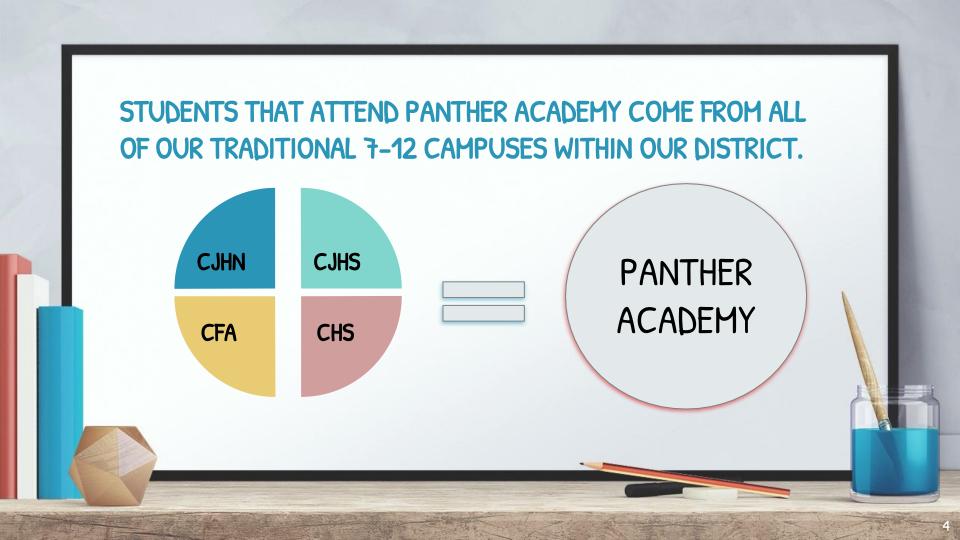

Panther Academy allows students to work at their own pace on a schedule that best suits them regardless of their other responsibilities, transportation needs, and split schedule options.

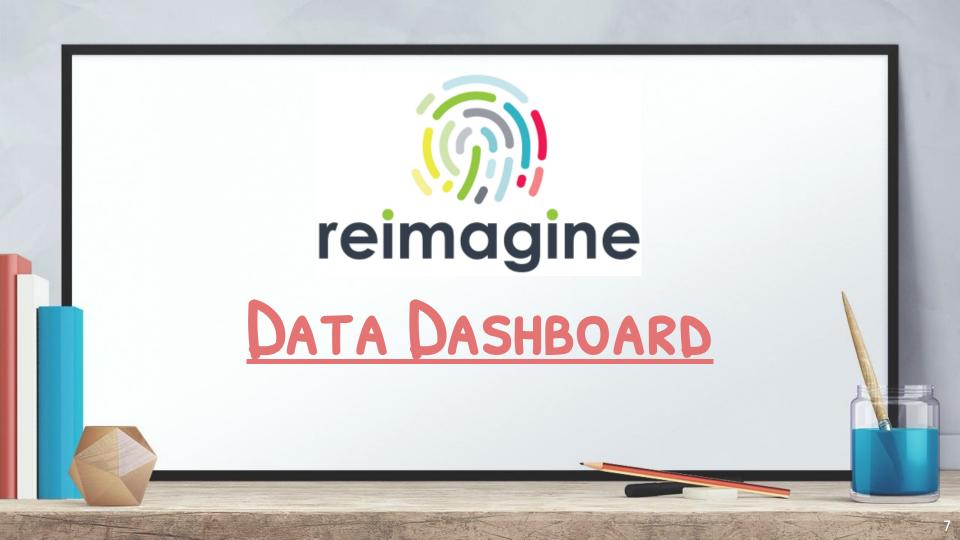

There are many reasons why our students have chosen Cabot Panther Academy as their home campus, but hearing from them may help you better understand why this campus is the best fit for them and their family.





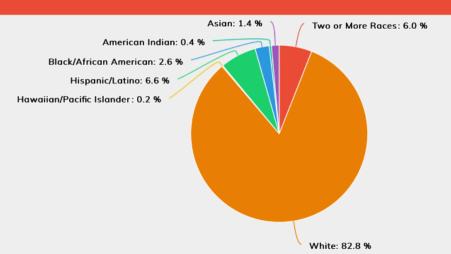
#### DISTRICT DEMOGRAPHICS



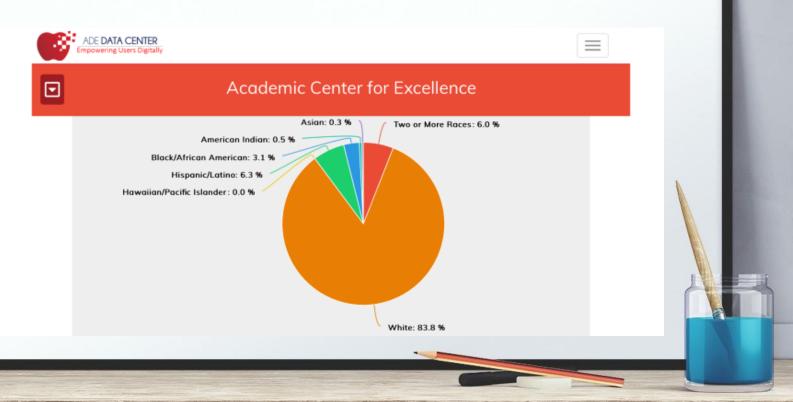

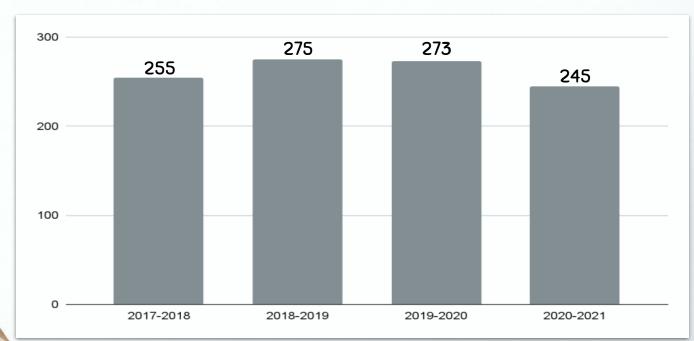
