Cell Phone Use in Schools

The issue of cell phones was never talked about when I was in school. Back then the phone weighed almost 10 pounds, was the size of a small duffel bag, had an antenna 2 feet long and it cost a fortune to buy and use. That is not the case these days. Today phones are smarter, smaller, inexpensive and convenient. I have even heard people say, "I can't imagine life without a cell phone". Oh, how times have changed.

Cell phone use in schools have become an increasingly "Hot Topic" with school districts and legislators. With the increased ease of cell phones in our society the increase of cell phone abuse is on the rise as well. Cell phones are used to bully, harass, threaten and harm.

What can you do as a parent to prevent cell phone abuse? Below is a list questions you should be able to answer with your son or daughter to improve cell phone use in your family and in our schools.

What is the need my child has for a cell phone? Is the need convenience or necessity? Is this for emergencies only? Who will they talk to? What will happen to the phone during school hours? Does it need text messaging? Who will they be sending text messages to? What will they be texting? Why does my child need a camera/video phone? Can I monitor the use of the camera and the photos they take? Do I know all the capabilities the phone has? Does it have internet access? Can I disable the internet access?

If you cannot comfortably and easily answers all these questions and communicate them with your son or daughter, then they should not have a cell phone. If a teen needs a cell phone for emergencies then invest in a "Pay as you go" phone without text or picture capability. You will be able to monitor the usage more effectively and not have to worry about using it in class to text message or to take those inappropriate or illegal pictures. Safe and appropriate uses of technology are new issues that schools and families must address as partners. Let's help each other make our children's online/mobile world a safer and more responsible place to be. Please check with our office for LBMS policy.

Currently, over 75% of our students have Gold Cards. What does it mean to have a Gold Card? Gold Cards are the ticket to participation in special activities that occur daily, weekly, and by trimester. Students are encouraged to keep their Gold Card on their person at all times. ### STUDENT ABSENCES AND EXCUSES

Daily attendance and punctuality are absolutely necessary for a student to gain maximum benefits from his/her educational experience.

Oregon school law supports the Board's view, and restricts excused absences to illness of the student, student medical or dental appointments (confirmation of appointments may be required), illness in the immediate family which requires the student's presence at home, when the tenets of the student's religion require an absence for religious observance of a holiday or emergency situations that require the student's absence. All other absences must meet the approval of the school officials or be treated as unexcused absences. An absence that does not meet the criteria of an excused absence but has been confirmed by the parent will be marked as a "verified" absence.

Absences will only be excused or verified if a phone call is received from the parent/guardian the day the student is absent or a note received in the school office not more than 3 days after the child returned to school.
