
We are off to a fantastic start this year at Illinois Valley High School

Congratulations to those parents who won the backpack and shirts. Together, we're building momentum for a year full of excellence and determination!







When Teens Seem Silent: Understanding and Supporting Communication

From the Counselor's Desk

I have been a mental health counselor working with children and families in Josephine County for over 25 years. During this time, the number one complaint I hear from struggling teens is this: when I ask, 'What do your parents say?' they often respond, 'My parents and I never talk about this kind of stuff.' This highlights how important open, ongoing conversations are between parents and teens.

It's easy for parents to assume their teenagers don't want to talk—especially when conversations get short answers or eye rolls. In reality, many teens still crave support and connection but may express it differently. Adolescence is a stage of seeking independence, so while teens may appear distant, they often still value knowing their parents are there when needed.

Why Teens May Seem Distant

Normal Development: Pulling away is part of building independence and identity.

Internal Processing: Many teens prefer to sort out emotions privately—through journaling, music, sports, or other hobbies—before sharing.

Mixed Signals: A quiet mood may not mean disinterest. Parents sometimes misinterpret "space" as rejection.

Bridging the Communication Gap

Ask Open-Ended Questions: Swap "How was your day?" for "What's been on your mind today?" to encourage more than one-word replies. (nhs.uk)

Practice Active Listening: Give full attention, avoid interrupting, and ask clarifying questions to show you care.

Validate Their Feelings: Even if you don't agree, reassure your teen that their feelings are real and understandable. (Nexus Teen Academy)

Offer Support, Don't Force It: Respect when they need space. Remind them you're available and return to the conversation later.

Recognize Normalcy: Testing limits and pulling away is part of growing up. Your steady connection helps them feel secure.

Key Takeaway for Parents

Even if your teen seems quiet, don't assume they don't want to talk. Most adolescents value parental presence, patience, and understanding—just on their own terms. A balance of respect for independence and gentle, open communication helps teens feel supported without feeling pressured.

• Consistent efforts to listen, validate, and stay present will keep the parent-teen bond strong through this stage of growth.










The core message of Red Ribbon Week is to:
