

COUNSELORS CORNER

Dear Parents and Guardians,

I hope this message finds you well. At Neah-Kah-Nie Middle School we are dedicated to ensuring the safety and well-being of all our students. Today, I want to discuss an important topic that affects the school environment and our students: bullying.



Bullying can have a significant impact on a child's emotional and psychological well-being, as well as their ability to succeed academically. Our commitment to addressing this issue is unwavering, and I hope to provide you with information and resources to help us combat bullying together.

What is Bullying?

Bullying is defined as unwanted, aggressive behavior that involves a real or perceived power imbalance. It can take many forms, including verbal, physical, relational, and cyberbullying. It's essential that we work together to identify and address these behaviors in order to create a safe and inclusive environment for all students.

Working Together to Prevent Bullying

Preventing bullying is a collaborative effort that involves not only school staff but also parents, guardians, and students themselves. Here are some ways we can work together to address this issue:

<u>Open Communication</u>: Encourage your child to communicate openly with you about their experiences at school, including any instances of bullying.

<u>Teach Resilience</u>: Help your child develop resilience and coping skills to deal with bullying if they encounter it.

<u>Be a Role Model</u>: Model respectful and kind behavior for your child and encourage them to do the same.

<u>Support a Positive School Culture</u>: Encourage a culture of kindness, empathy, and inclusivity in our school community.

Reporting Bullying Incidents

If your child is experiencing bullying or if you suspect that bullying is happening at our school, we strongly encourage you to report it as soon as possible. To make the reporting process as easy and accessible as possible, we have two options to address safety concerns in our school building.

SAFE Oregon provides a safe, confidential, and anonymous way to report bullying, harassment, or other safety issues. Reports can be made through their website (www.safeoregon.com) or by calling or texting their tip line at 1-844-472-3367. You also can contact the school principal, Lori Dilbeck, with any bullying concerns by calling or emailing her at lorid@nknsd.org. Rest assured, every report is taken seriously, and steps will be taken to investigate and address the issue. For more information on board policy see this link here.



UAPING AND STRESS

Students that vape often report that they do it to relieve stress, as a way to cope or to feel better with their anxiety. A temporary relief can be felt when using nicotine by vaping or smoking. However, over time, nicotine adds to your stress levels. Nicotine addiction happens quickly, where the body requires more and more nicotine to feel the same temporary pleasurable affects. When that pleasure feeling fades, nicotine withdrawal symptoms set in, increasing stress levels. Cravings increase as the body needs more nicotine to feel "normal" again. Teens who smoke or vape regularly experience more feelings of stress than teens who do not. If you want to talk about vaping or alternate ways to reduce stress, make an appointment with your school nurse or counselor.

Parents/Guardians—talk to your students about vaping. Early and often conversations are important. Let the school know if we can support these conversations started at home. This is Quitting, a free and anonymous teen quitting support—text DITCHVAPE to 88709 to start!


NKN ROBOTICS 2023

Saturday October 28th was our first meet of the season for NKN Robotics. Three teams traveled to Hillsboro High School for the first of five league events between now and February. The other events are on November 11th, December 9th, January 6th, and February 3rd. Yesterday our three teams competed against 12 teams from around Northwest Oregon. One of my proudest moments - might be that my teams were some of the first to complete robot and field inspections. They came prepared and ready to compete!

The Menacing Muffin Dragons had a very successful start to their season ranked 3rd out of 15 teams at the meet. They were actually the first team in our league (partnered with our Argonauts team) to complete the first mosaic of the season - placing three tiles on the backdrop in a particular orientation/color grouping. It doesn't look like much, but it was an impressive moment.

The 47 points they earned in that round set them up early for a strong showing.

They actually had the simplest and most innovative paper airplane launcher design and other teams came over to see it, and were super impressed with how it works. A simple pin on a string is pulled out of 3D printed plane mount by a small servo motor, and a rubber band provides the energy to send the mount down a rail until it stops suddenly at the end and sends the plane aloft.
