DEFINITION	A "paging device" is a telecommunications device that emits an audible signal, vibrates, displays a message, or otherwise summons or delivers a communication to the possessor. The term does not include an amateur radio under the control of an operator who holds an amateur radio station license issued by the Federal Communications Commission.
PAGING DEVICES POLICY	The Board may adopt a policy prohibiting students from possessing paging devices while on school property or while attending school-sponsored or school-related activities on or off school property.
PENALTIES	The policy may establish disciplinary measures to be imposed for violation of the prohibition and may provide for confiscation of the paging device.
DISPOSAL	The District policy may provide for: <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Disposal of a confiscated paging device in any reasonable manner, provided the student's parent and the paging company whose name and address appear on the device are given 30 days' notice of the intent to dispose of the device. Such notice may be made by telephone, telegraph, or in writing, and must include the serial number of the device.</li><li>2. Charging the owner of the device or the student's parent an administrative fee of not more than \$15 before it releases the device.</li></ol>

TELECOMMUNICATIONS DEVICES District employees may confiscate telecommunications devices, including mobile telephones, used in violation of applicable campus rules.

The District shall not charge a fee for the release of a telecommunications device. In accordance with the student handbook, the student or the student's parents may retrieve a device after receiving notification from the District.

If a telecommunications device is not retrieved, the District shall dispose of the device after providing notice required by law.

OTHER ELECTRONIC DEVICES

Guidelines regarding other electronic devices shall be addressed in the student handbook.
