

Bridgman High School Student Code of Conduct

2025-2026

Regulations covered in this handbook are in effect at school or at any school approved activity on or off school property. The following are the most common examples of violations of the Student Code of Conduct. The listed penalties are a possible range of penalties. The administration has the right to invoke any disciplinary measure necessary to insure the positive operation of the school. Referrals to police and juvenile authorities will be made when appropriate. All staff may refer students for infractions.

- 1 Public Act No. 103 -"Snap Suspensions": If a teacher in a public school has good reason to believe that a pupil's conduct in class, subject, or activity constitutes conduct for which the pupil may be suspended, the teacher may cause the pupil to be suspended from class for up to one (1) full day.

- 2 OSS - Out of School Suspension: A student suspended from school cannot participate in any school related activities, day or night during the out-of-school suspension. The student is not to be on or around school property at any time. Students who violate this regulation will be subject to police action for trespassing. OSS suspensions will not be counted towards the overall number of days absent when tabulating the loss of credit for a class.

***In the event school is cancelled on a day that the student is scheduled for OSS, the student will return on their originally established date.

- 3 Expulsion - Expulsion constitutes exclusion from school. The building principal may recommend expulsion proceedings whenever the documented behavior pattern of the individual or the seriousness of the offense is a substantial disruption to the educational process of the Bridgman Public Schools. After the recommendation is made by the building principal, parents may request a hearing with the Superintendent of Schools. Other action would follow as per the district expulsion policy.

ASD: After School Detention device

ISS: In School Suspension

OSS: Out of School Suspension

ECD: Electronic communication

The definitions of misconduct at each level are not all-inclusive but only representative and illustrative. A student who commits an act of misconduct not listed herein is nonetheless subject to disciplinary action. Discipline is within the sound discretion of the school's staff and administration and the administration will determine appropriate consequences for violating policy. Due process ensures that disciplinary action is imposed only after review of the facts and /or special circumstances of the situation.

***Specific explanations of all discipline violations are contained within the Bridgman High School Student/Parent Handbook or within the Bridgman Schools Board of Education Policies. The Code of Conduct does not incorporate the Athletic Code that is adopted yearly by the Bridgman Schools Board of Education. If an athlete at Bridgman High School has a discipline issue, they are subject to discipline from both Bridgman High School as well as the Bridgman Athletic Code.

REPEAT OFFENDER

Students who accumulate fifteen suspensions (OSS) in a school year, or have established a pattern of misbehavior from a previous school year to the present may be considered for an alternative placement or expulsion.

Arson	All Arson Offenses = Police notification + 10 Days OSS + Expulsion hearing before the Board of Education + Restitution.

Careless Driving <i>Driving too fast/recklessly in the parking lot or around the school campus or a school event.</i>	1st Offense = Parent Notification + 1 ASD 2nd Offense = 1 Day of ISS & Loss of driving privilege for grading period 3rd Offense= 2 Days of ISS & Permanent loss of driving privileges

Cell Phones/Music Player (IPOD's, etc...)/Head Phones/Electronic Communication Devices (ECD's): <i>Cell phone and/or headphone use in the classroom setting is at the discretion of the classroom teacher. White card = cell phone may be out and accessed at all times. Blue card = cell phone may be out and accessed only at the discretion of the teacher. Orange card = cell phone may not be out at any time and must be turned off. Students may use their phones during passing periods and lunch in accordance with the building ECD policy.</i>	1st Offense = Confiscation + Parent/Guardian pick up + 1 Lunch/ASD 2nd Offense = Confiscation + Parent/Guardian pickup + 2 ASD 3rd Offense = Confiscation + Parent/Guardian must pick up + Loss of privilege to carry for the remainder of the school year + 1 Day of ISS **Pictures and videos are not to be taken in class or on school property without adult permission. The use of cell phones or video/camera equipment is strictly forbidden in all locker rooms, bathroom areas and other areas that privacy is expected. <i>* If a student is caught with an ECD during times when they have lost privileges to carry, it will result in an immediate 3 days Suspension from school for insubordination.</i>

Computer Technology and Networks <i>Any type of misuse of either school given or personal technology within the school setting (includes but is not limited to the use and access to all district devices and/or networks).</i>	<u>Minor Violation:</u> 1st Offense = Warning + Meet with Principal 2nd Offense = 1 ASD + Principal & Network Administrator conference + 1 week loss of privileges <u>Moderate Violation:</u> 1st Offense = Meet with Principal & 2 ASD + Loss of CPU privileges for remainder of the Marking Period. 2nd Offense = ISS until parent meeting takes place + Loss of CPU privileges for remainder of the semester. <u>Severe Violation:</u> All Offenses = ISS/OSS until parent meeting + Loss of privileges for the remainder of the school year.

Disruption of Educational Process <i>Any actions or manner of dress that interferes with school activities or disrupts the educational process is unacceptable. Falsification of school work, identification, and/or forgery <i>Cheating and Plagiarism is the practice of knowingly and willfully sharing/exchanging information on assignments (homework & class work), test/quizzes, and/or projects. This includes COPYING someone else's work and /or presenting it as your own (plagiarism). Cheating also includes talking during tests/quizzes, using "cheat sheets," using "artificial intelligence (AI)", use of an ECD, notes, etc. while in testing situations. Cheating will NOT be tolerated. Students are not allowed to admit individuals, including other students, to the school.
