Observations:

- 10 of 13 students on IEP (77%)
- 11 male students (85%), 2 female students (15%)
- 6 white students (46%), 5 black students (38%), 1 Hispanic student(7.5%), 1 Multiracial student (7.5%)
- 5 students with one incident, 8 with multiple incidents
- 1 student had 17 incidents (at Serendipity)
- For kids with multiple incidents-often few days apart
- Running is major behavior prompting restraint, generally with younger students
- Lots of kicking, hitting, throwing, pushing, attempting to bite
- Very similar pattern to 09-10

Positives:

- Staff use strategies to bring calm and use proper protocol from training
- Parent notice and debriefing with team is documented more consistently.
- Debriefing notes reflect more consistent use of data, planning based on the function of behavior, teaching alternative strategies, staff practicing OIS strategies

Concerns:

- Unreported incidents
- Multiple incidents with a general education student
- Incomplete forms
- Consistent reporting from outside placements (Safe/quiet rooms not counted as seclusion)
