


We were thrilled to host the school board meeting last week and that presentation was in fact our report.



Credit Recovery

- A student is eligible for credit recovery if he/she finishes a class with a 45-59%.
- Must bring grade up to 70% or higher.
- Students work on lessons, projects, and presentations in that subject area and each assignment has to be done at a C level or better.
- Nearly 100 credits have been recovered this year by students at the Academy!

Who is this for?

- Students who have finished all credit recovery;
- Students who have enrolled midway through a quarter;
- Students who are planning, for one reason or another, to be away from school for a period of time;
- Students who have only one or two classes that are needed to graduate, but those classes are not currently being offered.
