

- Follow the dress code regulations.
- Be polite and courteous.
- Walk in a line with your class in the hallways.
- Pass through the halls quietly and be considerate to others in the halls and classrooms.
- Place all trash in containers and help keep the school clean by picking up any trash you may
 encounter by properly disposing of it.

ASSEMBLIES

A student's conduct in assemblies must meet the same standard as in the classroom. A student who does not follow District rules of conduct during an assembly will be subject to disciplinary action.

DRESS AND GROOMING

Students shall come to school looking clean, neat, and modest, wearing clothing and exhibiting grooming that will not be a distraction to other students and the educational environment or a health and safety hazard to the student or others as determine by a school administrator. The District prohibits pictures, emblems, or writings on clothing that are lewd, offensive, vulgar, obscene, and gang-related, or that advertise tobacco products, alcoholic beverages of any kind, drugs, or any other substance prohibited under school policy. Policy also prohibits any dress or grooming that, in the principal's judgment, may reasonably be expected to interfere with normal school operations. Never permissible in any of Luling Schools are bandanas, head rags, hats, caps, sunglasses, dangling chains or belts, bizarre apparel or anything that in any way is gang-related. However, permissible outside of the school facilities are hats, caps and sunglasses at the discretion of the administration.

Elementary School Dress and Grooming Code

Pre-Kindergarten - Fifth Grade

- 1. No student on or about school property or at any school activity shall wear, possess, use, distribute, display, or sell any clothing, jewelry, emblem, badge, symbols, sign, or other things which are evidence of membership or affiliation in any gang.
- 2. Hair must be neat and clean. Males may not wear hair length below the bottom of the collar of a dress shirt.
- 3. Any hairstyle, which by its appearance causes a disruption of any kind, as determined by a school administrator, is unacceptable. (i.e. mohawks, hair dyed unnatural colors, hair cut designs)
- 4. Loose fitting shorts must fall no shorter than approximately 2 inches above the kneecap.
- 5. No excessively short or revealing dresses, skirts and shorts will be allowed; such clothes must be worn no shorter than approximately 2 inches above the kneecap. Shorts and skirts must still be 2 inches above the knee or as determined by a school administrator as appropriate, even if tights are worn underneath.
- 6. Half shirts, muscle shirts, shirts slit on sides, crop tops, spaghetti straps, strapless shirts or others which show the midsection (skin) on one's body are not allowed. Shoulder width of sleeveless shirts shall be 2 inches. Boys are to have shirts buttoned within two buttons on a normal shirt. Appropriate undergarments must be worn and covered, including undergarment T-shirts.
- 7. Oversized clothes, sagging, baggy, "see-through", and inappropriate tight fitting clothes are prohibited. Clothes must be worn at the natural waistline.
- 8. Clothing with conspicuously low necklines or backlines is not acceptable.
- 9. Bare feet, slippers/house shoes or athletic flip flops are not acceptable.
- 10. Students shall not be permitted to wear hats, caps, sunglasses, sweatbands, other disrupting apparel in any building on campus during school hours.
- 11. Garments that have spikes (including bracelets, necklaces and belts) are not permitted.
- 12. Clothing that displays violence, obscenity, tobacco products, alcoholic beverages, drugs, or any other substances prohibited under school policy are prohibited. (i.e. drug symbols or skulls)
- 13. Boys may not wear earrings. No visible body piercings and tattoos (real or pretend) will be allowed on campus or any school sponsored activity. Girls are permitted to wear earrings.
- 14. Any shoes with wheels are not allowed on campus.

Students wearing inappropriate clothing will not be allowed to disrupt the teaching and learning environment. Any clothing that administration deems inappropriate will not be permitted in the school environment. If students and/or parents question the appropriateness of the clothing, it should not be worn to school. Additional guidelines may be imposed by the school, advisor, or sponsor of any specific activity or function. All clothing is subjected to administrative approval.

ELECTRONIC DEVICES

Students are not permitted to use any electronic device during the school day without specific permission from school personnel. Electronic devices include, but are not limited to: cell phones, iPods, iPads, tablets, Smart watches, mp3 players, laptop computers, hand-held games, or any other electronic devices.

Failure to comply will result in the surrender of the device to school personnel with the following consequences being applied:

1st offense: Device is turned in to the office and returned to the student at the end of the school day. 2nd offense: Device is turned in to the office and will be relinquished only to a parent/guardian. 3rd offense and subsequent offense: Device is turned in to the office and will be relinquished to a parent/guardian at the end of the semester. Student could be subjected to additional consequences such as but not limited to: After School Detention, Saturday School, In School Suspension, or Out of School Suspension

Students that refuse to surrender the electronic device will be subject to disciplinary consequences for insubordination.

CAFETERIA

BREAKFAST

Breakfast is available to all students in the cafeteria from 7:30 a.m. to 7:55 a.m.

LUNCH

Students may bring their lunch from home or may purchase a lunch from the cafeteria. A lunch menu is distributed to students at the beginning of each month.

Students are expected to conduct themselves appropriately while in the cafeteria. Students are to take everything they need, including napkins and utensils, as they go through the serving line. Returning to the serving line is not permitted. Students sit at assigned tables as indicated by the classroom teacher and may talk quietly to other students next to them or directly across the table from them. Students are to remain seating in the cafeteria through the lunch. As a health precaution, students are not allowed to share food. They are not permitted to leave the cafeteria except in case of an emergency. Students are under the supervision of the cafeteria monitors while at lunch and are expected to be respectful of the monitors.

HEALTH SERVICES

<u>NURSE</u>

Students who have an accident or become ill during school will be sent to the nurse's office. The school nurse or office clerk will examine the student and take the student's temperature and provide minor treatment as allowable The students will be returned to class as soon as possible. If the student is too ill to return to class, the parent will be called to pick up the student. Out of concern for the ill student and the other students who may be in the office, parents are expected to pick-up their children promptly after being notified.
