IVHS SUMMER SCHOOL 2011

Summer School at IVHS is a credit recovery program. Eligible students are those who have failed a core class needed for graduation. Letters and registration forms will be sent to eligible students and their families in early May.

However, there is an **important change** that we need families and students to start planning for early. The IVHS Site Council made the decision to charge students for summer school this year. Our reasons for doing this are:

- The grant funds that we have been using to pay for this program have ended.
- The old packet programs that we have been using are out of date and tedious for all.
- We will be using the Ed Options online program for credit recovery. There is a cost to us for this program—per computer.

We will be charging students \$50 a class but will refund 50% or \$25.00 of that when the student successfully completes the coursework. Every year we have at least 33% of the students who have signed up for summer school who either never show up or come the first day or two and then stop. We have hired staff to accommodate the number of students we expected and then sometimes have a teacher working with a handful for students for four weeks. This is not a good use of resources.

Usually the online credit recovery will allow us to:

- Offer more classes.
- Give students the opportunity to complete more than one class—with hard work.
- Use proficiency grading—students may be able to test out of portions of the class and not have to redo what they already know how to do. Many are likely to finish earlier.
- Hire fewer staff to teach, correct, and supervise.
- Provide more engaging and relevant materials to the students.
- Increase the level of commitment and accountability of the students.

We will allow parents to make payments but all students will be billed the full amount at the beginning of summer school. More information will be sent in May to families that will be affected

ESSENTIAL INFORMATION FOR THE CLASS OF 2011

Are you a senior going to college or trade school?

See Ms. Tucker in Counseling if you have any questions or want assistance with the scholarship financial aid application.

- **IV Scholarship Packet:** Go through the IVHS Scholarship Packet and decide which scholarships you want to apply for. You will need **two letters of recommendation** (at least one from non-school, non-family). Ask your employers, community members, or friends of the family. You will also need to turn in three staff recommendations and four typed scholarship statements. The scholarship application is available online at www.threerivers.k12.or.us, go to IVHS web site, then Ms. Tucker's teacher page to download forms. Due date is now—every day that goes by without turning this in, students miss out on deadlines for scholarships. Turn in to Ms. Gamble in Room 9.
- **Apply for RCC Foundation Scholarship:** If you may be attending RCC you should submit their scholarship application. Three out of four students who submit an application receive a scholarship. Apply online at www.rccfoundation.org.
- **Take the SAT:** If you are applying to a four year college, you need to take the SAT. The test will be given again at IVHS on May 7th. See Ms. Thornhill in the Counseling Center to see if you qualify for a fee waiver. Register for the SAT at www.collegeboard.com. Our school code is 380150
- **Apply to Schools:** Don't forget to get your application for admissions and scholarships in by school deadlines. If you qualify for free or reduced lunch, you may be eligible for a deferral of application fees to Oregon University System schools.

ESSENTIAL INFORMATION FOR THE CLASS OF 2011

SENIOR PROJECTS—MUST BE COMPLETED TO GRADUATE !

The last opportunity for seniors to present their projects is May 18, 2011 from 4:00 – 5:45. About half of the seniors have presented at the previous two opportunities. Senior parents, please, work with your student and encourage them to not procrastinate. Passing all components of the Senior Project is a requirement for graduation. Information about the overall senior project requirements follows below:

The Senior Project (officially known as the Career-Related Learning Standards and Extended Application) has been a state graduation requirement starting with the class of 2007. The two components of the project are passing the Senior Futures Forum class or the Senior College Prep class and passing the oral presentation. In their classes students research future careers, complete resumes and job applications, research post-secondary options and do mock interviews. In addition, they write a reflection paper on how their high school experiences have prepared them for their futures, connecting their high school experience to their post-secondary plans.

Students will present their project to a panel of judges comprised of administrators, school staff and community members. Projects are scored using the state scoring guide. Students must provide evidence of meeting two or more of the *Essential Skills* such as reading and interpreting text, applying math, speaking effectively and demonstrating community involvement. They must also include evidence that their project reflects two or more of the *Work Ethic Skills* such as time management, reliability, initiative, dedication, checking for accuracy, etc.

MISSING CREDITS NEEDED FOR GRADUATION ?

We have a number of seniors that must do some credit recovery in order to graduate this year. Since there are only **7 weeks** left to make up any failed credits from your four years of high school, you need to “pour on the fire”. You are nearly out of time. All work must be completed and graded by June 3 to walk in this year’s graduation. If you have classes to make up and are not currently working on them, see Ms. Tucker immediately. Ms. Engles or Mrs. Merrill will be available in Room 9, Monday—Thursday, from 3:30 to 5:30 to help you. Take advantage of this opportunity to make up those credits needed for graduation.

SENIORITIS!

This is the time of year to keep in close contact with the academic progress of your senior student. We have some seniors who are on a plan with counseling in order to complete all their credits for graduation by June the 3rd. Do not just assume that your student is doing what needs to be done. Senioritis has already hit! Stay in contact with their teachers, Ms. Tucker or one of the administrators to make sure your student is on target.

The last day of school for seniors is **June 3rd**. Students must have everything completed by the end of that day in order to walk at graduation on June 8th.

SYNERVOICE

After receiving an automated call concerning your student's absences from our new phone messaging system, Synervoice, please call the school in the morning to clear your student's absences. The number is 541-592-2116; ask for the attendance office. It is very important for you and your student to have these absences cleared. Students end up doing lunch detentions for uncleared absences.

We will sometimes use Synervoice to send out important messages about school closures and school events. When you get a call from the school using Synervoice, it is important that you say "hello" as this triggers the message. If you have voicemail, it will leave a message. If you have email registered with the school, we will often send emails as well.

S.A.T INFORMATION

If you have signed up to the SAT's on May 7th, IVHS will be proctoring them. Don't forget to be at IVHS shortly before 8:00 AM.

There are lots of online practice tests to help prepare for the SATs. Take a few of them and see how you do.

SENIOR SKIP DAY

Parents, please note that there is **no** sanctioned senior skip day. We do not encourage nor endorse a skip day for seniors. From past knowledge and experience most senior skip days involve alcohol and drugs and often older students attend and provide those things. Additionally, in some years there has been serious vandalism done to the property where the gatherings took place. Senior classes have lost some of their senior funds because of this vandalism. If senior students take a skip day, absences will not be excused.

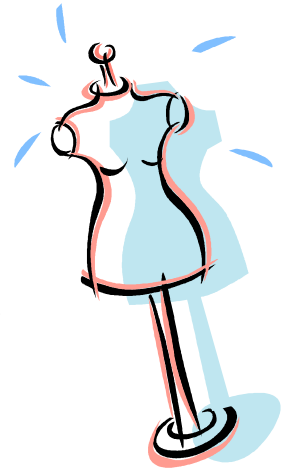
We ask for parents to help us with this and encourage your students to not participate in a senior skip day.

Dress Code for IVHS

Parents and Students this is a reminder of the dress code for Illinois Valley High School because the weather is starting to warm up. Please make sure your student (s) are adhering to the following rules. The rules are taken straight from the handbook that was signed by all students at the beginning of the school year.

Bizarre, immodest or revealing clothing demeans the value of the wearer and disrupts the educational atmosphere. It will not be permitted. You will be asked to cover or change out of the clothing that is unacceptable for reasons stated below. Examples of unacceptable dress includes: (bolded topics are the most problematic in the warmer weather)

- Clothing that depicts drugs, alcohol, tobacco, sexual acts, nudity or partial nudity, profanity or that in any way demeans others (i.e. race, gender, sexual orientation).
- **Shorts and skirts must be at mid-thigh length.**
- Bathing suit tops, **halter-tops, tube tops and strapless tops.**
- Clothing that reveals underwear. Loose or tight pants, shorts or skirts that reveal underwear are unacceptable.
- **Tops that are** too short (revealing midriff or stomach area), too tight, or **too low cut** (lower than the tops of the students armpit).
- Both male and female students must be fully clothed while on campus or involved in school-related activities.



When a student is not appropriately dressed for school, he/she will be reminded of the rules by staff members, asked to change clothing, and will receive a citation. Students who continue to fail to respond to the rules will be given consequences, up to and including suspension.



TRiO

Rogue Community College has the TRiO program (a federally funded program). If you meet the following eligibility requirements and want help navigating through the college process, please see Ms. Tucker in the counseling office for a TRiO application.

All participants must be able to demonstrate that they meet **federal TRiO guidelines**:

- To be eligible to take advantage of TRiO ETS services, you must qualify as low income and first generation student (your parents did not obtain a 4-year college degree); be low-income only; or be first generation only.
- All TRiO ETS participants must be a U.S. citizen or a qualified permanent resident.
- All applicants are required to complete a TRiO Application.

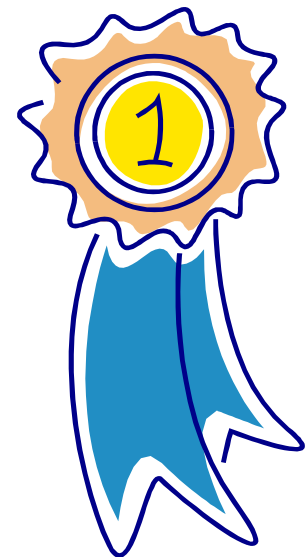
