Planning for the 2025-2026 school year is well underway. I want to provide a "thank you" to Andy Hamm for his innovative work in creating a Google Forms-based registration system. Both Andy and Karlene Berry have begun building preliminary master schedules for the 2025-2026 school year, in hopes of having schedules finalized for our high school student body ahead of summer break. As part of our ongoing efforts to enrich student experiences, we are thrilled to announce an expansion of our middle school music program. Beginning this fall, participation in band or choir will be required for all middle school students, replacing our current General Music 6. The impetus behind this change is directly related to the impact that music has on academic success. Data reveals the following -

We will begin sharing more information about these updates and other changes for the 2025-2026 school year starting in June, as we work to ensure a smooth transition to the upcoming school year.
