

Tentative and Final Amended Budget Timetable for the FY 26 School Year

The Business Office has finalized the tentative amended budget for FY 26 to allow the Board sufficient time to review and discuss the revenue and expenditures for the 2025-2026 school year. Since Illinois School Code requires that the tentative amended budget be placed on display so that the public may review the budget projections, the Tentative FY 26 Amended Budget will be available for public display and review by Monday, May 11, 2026, at 9:00 a.m. which properly establishes compliance with the rules and regulations for school district budgets. With this in mind, the following timetable for approving the Tentative FY 26 Amended Budget will allow sufficient time for the appropriate adoption of the FY 26 Amended Budget during the Board meeting on June 10, 2026:

- A. Wednesday, May 6, 2026: Adopt Resolution Authorizing Public Notice and Scheduling of a Hearing to Amend the FY 26 Budget.
- B. Monday, May 11, 2026: Place Tentative FY 26 Amended Budget on public display for the required thirty (30) days; May 11, 2026 through June 10, 2026.
 1. Submit public notice for local publication on May 6, 2026 that the tentative budget is available for review, and that a public hearing to approve the budget will be held on June 10, 2026.
 2. Review of the tentative budget will be during normal business hours in the school district office.
 3. Questions about the tentative budget will receive an appropriate response. Answers will be given promptly, when possible. If more time is needed to respond, district staff will make arrangements with the person asking the question.
 4. The public will have until June 10, 2026, to request a review of the tentative budget. This will be a total of thirty (30) days (Illinois law requires a minimum of thirty (30) days).
- C. During the display period, the tentative budget projections may change as new information is received. Any and all adjustments to the tentative budget will be properly documented and displayed for the public to view.
- D. For Board members, the display period is valuable because it allows sufficient time to review the budget projections, ask questions, and discuss any issues before adopting a final amended budget.
