

SISD Student Code of Conduct Summary of Changes 2023-2024

**HB 114 requires mandatory placement in a DAEP for selling, giving, delivering, possessing, using, or being under the influence of marijuana, THC, or e-cigarettes within 300 feet of school property.

** HB 114 also states when a DAEP is at capacity, a student who engaged in related marijuana, THC, e-cigarette, alcohol, or an abusive volatile chemical must be placed in ISS until the student can be transferred to a DAEP if space becomes available before the expiration of the period of the placement.

** HB 3928 requires the district to provide information to a student's parent about the process for requesting a full individual and initial evaluation of the student for purposes of special education services when a student is placed for a mandatory DAEP offense.

**HB 1427 expands the offense of harassment under Penal Code 42.07 to include making obscene, intimidating, or threatening telephone calls or other electronic communications from a temporary or disposable telephone number.
