We're continuing our jellyfish text this week, determining main idea and describing key details. We took a little

detour last week, reading about how snow crystals are formed; and students wrote booklets to describe that process. Informational writing projects are ongoing. As I said last week, quality work takes time, especially when snow is factored in!

In Math, we're currently working on different types of "joining" word problems.

HOMEWORK POLICY: Students are asked to read 20 minutes every night, record their time, and have a parent sign for full credit. The homework log is turned in every Thursday.

Math and/or Language Arts homework is expected only if a student does not complete their classwork that day. Students will record these assignments on their homework log. These assignments are due the following morning they were assigned.

Students will have a spelling test every other Thursday. **(Thursday, March 9th is the next test)**. They can study their spelling & vocabulary words any way they choose, in addition to completing the attached practice pages.

CURRENT FOCUS: We will be discussing "How do natural disasters affect people?" in our text "The Earth Dragon Awakes". **Sequencing Events** and **Visualizing** are our target ELA skills & strategies. In math, students will continue using representations and strategies to find whole-number quotients and remainders with up to four-digit dividends and one-digit divisors using strategies based on place value, the properties of operations, and/or the relationship between multiplication and division.
