

We've Been Learning . . .

In Language Arts, besides reading practice and writing super sentences, we do Language Arts warm-ups three days a week, and are being introduced to common and proper nouns, synonyms, antonyms, and contractions.

Place value continues to take center stage in our Math learning, and we have "bundled" popsicle sticks into groups of 10 and groups of 100 to illustrate how our number system works.

This week our spelling focus is words that end with double consonants ff. II, ss, and zz. The ones that we know will be on our test are pass and will. Our high frequency words will be why and when.

We continue to explore the concept of multiplication. Students should understand multiplication is actually a faster way to add equal groups.

For example 2+2+2+2=8, 4 groups of 2=8, and 4x2=8 all represent the same concept.

We will practice multiplication a lot at school, but it will not be enough. Please help your child memorize their multiplication facts by practicing at home with flashcards. writing on paper/whiteboards or orally in the car. So far, we've been working on memorizing our 2's facts. Coming next are multiplying by 5's and 10's.

Please reach out if you have any questions. A ParentSquare message is probably best. However, a handwritten note, phone call or email will work too.

Some of this week's skills:

Reading/Writing: Read and spell long vowel words. Compare and contrast stories and/or characters. Use details from a story to infer characters' intentions. Use evidence from a story to predict what will happen next.

Math: Represent multiplication as repeated addition 4+4+4=12 and equal groups (arrays). Use multiplication vocabulary: Factor and Product

Science: Introduce the differences between weather and climate. Identify the components of the water cycle and how it relates to weather. Identify how to be safe in extreme weather.

Thursday Sharing (Bring something non living to share with the class. It has to fit in a backpack): Bryson
