District Safety Team


We had our first district safety team meeting of the 2025-2026 school year to focus on auditing our building procedures and processes to make PG as safe as possible. With the addition of Crisis Go as our safety App, our buildings have been engaging in more frequent practice drills to be prepared in the event of emergencies. We have partnered closely with our police department and fire department to gather feedback and will be reaching out to the community and students for feedback as well.

Members of the leadership team and our SEL team attended a Threat Assessment training on Monday, October 20th facilitated by the McHenry County ROE. The focus was using the CStag protocol to learn best practices in threat assessment procedures.

- Our ROAR Committee has been hard at work delving into PBIS Structures in our school. Committee members created videos with their classroom students for expectations for various areas of the school such as the lunchroom, hallways, playground, restrooms, and more!
- The Building Leadership Team with establishing our vision for our team and school. Key points included that all students can learn in a warm and inviting environment that has high and consistent expectations. We will take collective responsibility to focus on the whole child and help them show growth in multiple areas. In collaboration with all stakeholders, we will help students grow and have high academic achievement in an engaging environment with a positive culture.
- Many of our grade levels have had fun fall field trips. Whether to the Nunda Township Fire Department, the pumpkin patch, or the apple orchard, our students are learning in and outside of school.
- Our new dismissal procedures have been going smoothly for Parent Pick-up. This has helped with safety for the buses returning from their routes and alleviated traffic extending onto Valley View.

Junior High

- The Junior High has had a busy and exciting October! We are keeping our focus on building connections in our school community, both in classrooms and at staff meetings. We also have been examining fall testing data, taking field trips, and creating opportunities for students to be part of a community.
- Our MTSS program for Tier 2 and Tier 3 intervention is in full swing. Junior High teams have met with Mrs. Master and Mrs. Sibenaller (MTSS Coordinator) to discuss how we can provide equitable support across the board to learners through our MTSS system. We are looking closely at how tier 1 intervention is used in the classrooms as well.
- Mrs. Master will be offering a variety of lunch and learn topics over the course of the rest of the year for staff, focusing on areas that staff would like to grow and learn more about.
- Our 6th grade students and helpful high school cadets left for Timber-lee on Wednesday, October 22 and returned on Friday, October 24. Students and staff had so much fun ziplining, learning about farm animals, participating in archery, leathermaking, and more. We want to give a special shout out to our high school cadets who worked hard to load the buses and guide our students as positive role models on the trip.
