MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Fruitdale Families,

As the year ends, parents begin to think about which class their child will be in next year at school. As most of you know we do not take parent requests for teacher/classroom placement. However, we do want to know if there are specific concerns or issues you have about your child to make a good decision in placing your child. If you wish to communicate those concerns you need to pick up a form in the office. The form will allow you to communicate those concerns so I can consider that when reviewing for final placement. Forms must be turned into the office by May 25th for consideration.

The placement process begins with the regular and special needs teachers at each grade level meeting to determine the best placement for each child. Where there are multiple classes for a grade this process will be in place. Teachers work together to develop classes that are likely to be successful as a unit when learning. Teachers consider the following information as they place students:

- Classes will be balanced for academic needs so that all children can receive what they need to be successful. This means having a good span of academic needs and abilities.
- We also look to balance students' special needs and behavioral needs. We look to see if we can separate students who have had serious social conflict in the past that might be disruptive to learning as school.
- We try to balance the number of boys and girls and even look to make sure we don't have five kids with the same first name!
- Please be assured; we place each child carefully in an environment we hope they can learn and grow in. Each child is considered. No choice is made without thought and planning.

Once teachers are finished I review the placement recommendations and then I also compare that with the information the parents provided. Most of the time, students are placed well based on the teacher's knowledge of their students. In some cases, parents will have provided information about something we have not known about or considered and then I may change the placement based on that information. We do not place children based on things like "My child needs to be with his best friend because they have always been in the same class", or "I want Mrs. because all of my other

children had her."

I appreciate your understanding on this matter. Please turn in your parent input form no later than May 25th, if you wish us to consider any special needs for your child while placing them for next year.
