TVAH Elementary September Progress Report

Campus Leadership and Culture

Johna Tritt began her role as Principal of TVAH Elementary on August 18, 2025. Since then, she has focused on building strong relationships with families and staff to foster a **positive and collaborative campus culture.** As part of this effort, all elementary teachers completed the **High 5 Strengths Survey**, which is being used to guide team-building and enhance collaboration within grade levels and departments.

Professional Learning Teams (PLTs)

TVAH Elementary has successfully implemented Professional Learning Teams (PLTs) to support instructional alignment and student achievement:

- 3rd and 4th Grades: PLTs are organized by grade level.
- **5th Grade:** PLTs are structured by core content areas.
- **Support Staff:** Special programs teachers, curriculum coordinators, and instructional coaches are actively participating in PLTs to ensure a unified instructional approach.

These teams are using data to drive instruction, share best practices, and monitor student progress.

Instructional Focus and Data-Driven Practices

Teachers are using **Beginning-of-Year (BOY)** assessment data to identify student needs and form **targeted small groups** for differentiated instruction. This data-driven approach ensures that instruction is responsive and personalized.

- Common Formative Assessments (CFAs) will begin next week to provide ongoing checkpoints for student learning.
- **Stride Tutoring** will also launch next week for all 3rd grade reading students, offering additional support and intervention.

Campus STAAR Goals

TVAH Elementary has set ambitious goals for the 2025–2026 STAAR assessments:

- Overall Goal: Increase the number of students in the Approaching and Meets performance categories in Math, Reading, and Science by 15% for each cohort group.
- G/T Goal: Increase the number of Gifted/Talented students achieving Meets and Masters levels by 10%.

These goals are guiding instructional planning, intervention strategies, and professional development.

Next Steps

- Continue strengthening PLT collaboration and data analysis.
- Monitor the impact of Stride Tutoring and adjust as needed.
- Use CFA data to refine small group instruction.
- Continue building a culture of trust, collaboration, and high expectations.

Middle School

With the winds of autumn upon us, TVAH Middle School is getting into the groove of using our new systems and becoming experts on the different ways to use them to support student learning. Our main focus as we have launched into the 25-26 school year has been intentional collaboration that is data driven and aligned to high impact state standards that help students master their grade level TEKS. Our approach is centered around three main priorities:

- Our teams began meeting regularly to review what student data we currently have available
 with the intent to implement instructional strategies and lessons that are engaging and
 impactful.
- Teams use this time to identify trends, adjust instruction, and plan targeted interventions and enrichment opportunities.
- Student progress will continue to be monitored and instruction adjusted to ensure continuous improvement with the goal of closing the gaps.

▼Team Collaboration

- The Middle School teams have been outstanding examples of how team collaboration with a focus on student success can and should be done!
- Our grade-level teams are working hard to align instructional strategies and share best practices so that ALL students can succeed.
- They have set goals, reflected on best practices, celebrated successes, and pulled together to troubleshoot and overcome technical issues.

TEKS Deep Dive

- Our teachers have begun the process of really diving into and studying the TEKS to ensure a deep understanding of the what our students need to do to be successful.
- PLTs are unpacking the TEKS, clarifying learning objectives, and designing live instruction that will build toward mastery.
- Additionally, teachers are working to ensure that intentional scaffolding is included in the planning process to help students develop foundational skills and higher order thinking that is

aligned to the state expectations.

We believe with our intentional and structured PLT process our campus is creating a culture of continuous improvement where the success of all students is at the forefront of all our decision making. Our commitment to data-driven PLTs, team collaboration, and rigorous TEKS study ensures every student is supported in achieving academic success.

High School

We are excited to be entering our second month of school!

September has been filled with school spirit and communitybuilding as we kicked off the year with fun Homecoming
challenges. Highlights have included themed days such as
Neon/Glitter Day and Overalls Day, where we celebrated the idea of
having an "overall" great year.



Our staff and students have demonstrated dedication and a positive attitude as they continue to adapt to our new learning platform. The transition gets a little better each day, thanks to everyone's hard work and collaboration.

We have fully kicked off our Professional Learning Team (PLT) time. Each team has worked collaboratively to set group norms, establish meaningful goals, and outline clear expectations for their weekly meetings. This structured time is already fostering strong collaboration and a shared focus on student learning and growth.

We are also excited to report significant growth in our FLEX program this year, which has expanded by over 1,200 students! This program offers true flexibility, allowing students to learn at their own pace and tailor their education to fit their individual needs. We're proud to provide this innovative option to support a wide variety of learners. Additionally, the Stride National Team has identified our Flex program at TVAH as a potential model to pilot FLEX initiatives at other schools across the network.

Looking ahead, we are thrilled for our first outing of the year, scheduled for October 13, as well as our upcoming virtual professional development in mid-October. We're eager to continue building connections, strengthening our practice, and making this school year a memorable one.

Title 1

Our Title 1 team has been doing great things in support of families and campuses to launch the school year!

Families have been buzzing with excitement this season! We've had an incredible turnout at our parent meetings, kicked things off with our very first townhall where over 500 parents joined in, and officially launched our workshops—including wrapping up a fantastic photography session (see photo below). Our full team of ambassadors has been working nonstop to keep families informed and engaged, even hosting multiple open office hours during launch, and we celebrated Homecoming during our morning Den time to bring everyone together in the spirit of community.

All in all, it's been a huge success, and parents have shared how much they value the extra support and opportunities to be part of the journey!

The Behavior Program is off to a strong start with over 40 students currently enrolled. Students are beginning to find their rhythm and are experiencing the positive outcomes that come with fully engaging in the program's supports and resources. Our DAEP program is gaining recognition, and schools are actively referring families to us as an alternative support option for their students. We are encouraged by this growth and optimistic about the opportunities this year will bring.

With the first few weeks behind us, we are excited to launch our Bridge Program to provide additional layers of support for students who need it. We are working closely with both parents and students to develop individualized plans designed to foster academic achievement and emotional well-being.

Our curriculum and instruction teams are in strong support of student achievement starting with Curriculum Coordinators attending PLT meetings and have started their bi-monthly collaborations with the Department Chairs. They are also re-auditing the 3-5 curriculum for alignment and to ensure we have appropriate pacing and assessments throughout. We are on track to have any semester 2 courses completed by October 31st, for department feedback throughout November. The Instructional Specialists will use BOY diagnostic data to develop targeted sessions for our high flyers, and for our students who need more support but do not qualify for services through Comp Ed or Tier 2. We are prioritizing 3rd grade and 8th grade for these groups, as these are critical grade levels developmentally and academically. Our goal is to move students from "Meets" to "Masters" and ensure any students who fall between "DNM" and "Approaches" stay firmly in "Approaches" or higher.


TVAH PLC Process

Principals will begin a book study on *Transforming School Culture: How to Overcome Staff Division*, by Anthony Muhammad in October. This book identifies four types of educators - the Believers, the Fundamentalists, the Tweeners, and the Survivors - and offers strategies for working with each to cultivate positive environments that maximize organizational effectiveness. We will also be offering a book study to Assistant Principals, Lead Teachers, and Department Chairs on *Learning By Doing, 4th Edition* to set a strong foundation of the PLC process for staff members who are direct support to our teaching teams. This book study is also set to begin in October.
