several deep discussions on this matter and visited with community members to try to find ways we can help to enhance student attendance. Our superintendent visited our school and it was reported that as a district, we are working towards a minimum 80% attendance goal. We are planning the first SAC meeting of the new school year in August to have a community feed sponsored by our SAC and have a deeper discussion with community members (one SAC member per group of tables) as to how we can help get the message of the importance of attendance. This will be an overarching highlighted discussion topic for all of our 2023-2024 school year.

We had many community comments and concerns voiced either in the meeting or to an individal SAC member about different aspects of our school. We have worked with our principal to help find solutions or answer questions and put plans into effect to help troubling areas. We are very pleased that the community is coming forth with questions or concerns. This sharing of ideas and issues shows us that our community cares deeply about our children's education and help to create an open dialoge to work together to make our school great.

Our greatest success for our SAC has been several groups of students have come to our meeting to ask for help or to find solutions to issues that concern them. Our middle school students have attended several meetings to ask for support to increase their opportunities for athletics. Both times, students spoke up about their wants and spoke up about how they felt. We were proud to help them be successful and helped to find opportunities for them to participate in athletics. We are most proud that they have found their voice and use it to work towards their goal. They did not just complain, the put together great presentations and had a positive goal in view. We hope to see this trend increase as our students learn to speak up for themselves. We are proud to see future leaders stand up and use their voice in positive ways to help their educational programs.

One area of concern that we have discussed and see a great need is hiring full time teachers for each of our classrooms.
