My mission is to:

- Provide research based information, modeling, and training for teachers and administrators within Vicksburg Community Schools and to paying client districts outside of Vicksburg.
- 2. Create opportunities for VCS teacher leaders to emerge.
- 3. Provide principals with research based information and best practice skills for their complex roles as instructional leaders.
- 4. Promote VCS at every possible opportunity.
- 5. Consult outside of VCS to provide revenue for the VCS New Teacher Induction Program and Leadership Training for Mentor Teachers.

All of this is done to consistently maintain and improve quality instruction for every VCS student.

Responsibilities

Graduate Course Instructor:

- 1. Plan a syllabus for each graduate credit course, according to university format.
- 2. Submit updated proposals each academic year.
- 3. Model best practice in each session.
- 4. Encourage teachers in activities to check for understanding and to experience instructional concepts.
- 5. Create an environment for learning, interaction, and inquiry.
- 6. Provide teachers with discussion in vertical and horizontal teams to determine application of best practices.
- 7. Observe teachers in their classroom to provide feedback on use of course information.
- 8. Observe teachers in their classroom to provide a coaching forum, not evaluation.
- 9. Conduct feedback activities to gather teacher responses about course information, presentation, application, and teacher self-reflection.

PIT Crew Co-Facilitator with John O'Toole:

This year John and I have taken on an increased role at PIT Crew. We drafted a school year long calendar of topics. We draft an agenda each month for Charlie's approval. We facilitate about half of each agenda. The goal of PIT Crew is to bring principals, teacher leaders, and VAB staff together in a Professional Learning Community culture to compare and contrast curriculum buildings. We learn and grow together.

Mentor Coordinator:

- 1. Maintain and improve our program design, training for mentors, and services to new teachers.
- 2. Design a record keeping system for reporting and assessing mentor activities.
- 3. Offer classes and bi-monthly meetings to update information and maintain a sense of urgency for our mission.
- 4. Provide a discussion forum for new teachers and mentors to hone our teaching strategies and our coaching practices.

SBCEU Coordinator:

I work with Barb Sinclair to complete the complex applications for SB-CEU program approval and to maintain the meticulous records required for SB-CEUs. Thanks, Barb!

School Improvement Professional Development Facilitator:

This year, we have moved to the SIPD model for two days of site designed professional development. That has involved:

- Creating a new working model for proposals, committee review, facilitation and training procedures, record keeping, and reporting which maintain the high standards for all of VCS professional development.
- 2. Cheryl Ulsh has been invaluable in providing the technology support necessary to make this program happen. Thank you, Cheryl.
- 3. Streamlining of the process will continue for 2010-2011.

Vicksburg Ambassador:

Susan Villani, editor of <u>Comprehensive Mentoring Programs for New Teachers</u>, Corwin Press (2009), asked me to present our program model on a panel at two national conferences. One was at the National Staff Development Council in St. Louis, Missouri in December 2009. I was not able to attend that venue, but our information was presented. The other opportunity occurred at the New Teacher Center National Conference in San Jose, CA during February 2010.

The VCS model was presented in a panel format with other programs from WestEd Lab, Georgia State University, New Teacher Center in Santa Cruz, and the Special Education District in St. Louis County. Good company!

Consultant:



Academic Coach Coordinator:



What are SBCEU's?

State Board-Continuing Education Units (SBCEUs) are State Board approved in-service, workshop, training, or conference credits that are used for the renewal of selected certificates issued by the Michigan Department of Education (MDE). SBCEUs are calculated by dividing the total number of contact or instructional hours by the number 10. Thus, an eight (8) hour session would be eligible to receive eight tenths (.8) of an SBCEU.

Literacy Coaches Are Now Academic Coaches

In the spring of 2009, we decided to change the title of our Literacy Coaches to Academic Coaches. The rationale was that we wanted our trained coaching staff to provide support to teachers in the new math program as well as our literacy program.

So now at Vicksburg Community Schools, an Academic Coach is a teacher leader who has been trained in the Vicksburg Community Schools' Balanced Literacy Program and Balanced Math Program. Each teacher leader has received additional training in coaching, adult learning, and presentation skills. S/he agrees to be pro-active in the promotion of teaching literacy and math.

- Support with <u>coaching</u> conversations, meetings, demo lessons, and printed resources, observations and feedback
- Present at district/building professional development meetings
- Problem solve
- Motivate by conscious expectations, positive role model

Expectations

- Attend training workshops and informational meetings
- Be available for on-on-one coaching conversations
- Provide materials to teachers
- Present professional development sessions
- Model / demo lessons in own class and other's class
- Observe and provide feedback
- Hold teacher information meetings, if needed
- Insert literacy and math topics at staff meetings, as needed
- Model positive, professional attitudes about learning, teaching, and change
- Establish communication with principals while maintaining confidentiality about individual teachers
- Continue to learn and grow as a teacher of reading, writing, and math
- Keep current on your professional reading
- Maintain records on coaching activities
