Topic	2024–2025 Code	2025–2026 Code
E-Cigarette Infractions	E-cigarette use or possession, <b>regardless of content</b> , resulted in mandatory DAEP placement.	E-cigarette <b>infractions not involving marijuana or THC</b> are no longer mandatory DAEP; ISS or other interventions may be used.
In-School Suspension (ISS) Limits	<b>3-day cap</b> on ISS length	No limit to ISS days, but a <b>review must occur every 10 days</b> to assess continued placement.
Personal Communication Devices	Use was <b>regulated per campus or teacher</b> policy.	<b>Use is prohibited during the school day</b> , unless specifically authorized ( <i>e.g., IEP or instructional purposes</i> ). Devices must be stored per district guidelines.
Antisemitism as a Conduct Violation	<b>Not specifically listed</b> in conduct violations.	<b>Behavior motivated by antisemitism</b> is now explicitly prohibited under “Mistreatment of Others.”
