The Troup Independent School District is comprised of three campuses: Troup High School, Troup Middle School, and Troup Elementary School. The school district serves a majority of lower socio-economic students. Troup ISD serves approximately 1,086 students in grades Pre-K through 12th grade. Troup Elementary School is comprised of grades PK-5th. Troup Elementary serves approximately 501 students. Over time our student populations fluctuates.

At Troup Elementary, the organizational structure is a combination of several different styles: self-contained and departmentalized by grade level. The student population is 6.18% African-American, 75% White, .007% Asian, 13% Hispanic, .02% Native Indian, two or more races 5%, and 43% low socioeconomic status.
