1. CALL TO ORDER

2. Call to Order Finance Committee Chair Jessica Arzate called the meeting to order.

3. Financial update

- a. The Resolution Services Fund cash balance is 79% lower compared to last year, primarily due to districts utilizing more funds and the early issuance of \$900,000 in transit dollars in October.
- b. The contracted services fund is showing a negative cash balance, attributed to timing issues.
- c. Financial statements are progressing but will not be ready for board presentation until January 2024. Deadlines for submission to the state remain on track.

4. Audit Presentation

- a. TKW is finalizing the audit, which will be issued by December 31, with the formal presentation planned for January.
- b. Updates include compliance with GASB 101 (new standards for compensated absences) and GASB 100 (clarifications on accounting changes and errors).
- c. Key audit focus areas: Management's Discussion and Analysis (MD&A), independent auditor's report, and findings in the Schedule of Findings and Ouestioned Costs.

5. PCEF Grant

- a. The joint application for round 2 funds by MESD and five districts was recommended for a \$70.4 million grant, awaiting final approval by Portland City Council on December 18. MESD will act as the fiscal agent for the funds
- b. MESD is using some of its round 1 funds to perform energy audits and facility assessments.

6. New Grant Manager

a. Jamie Campos, currently CFO at Columbia Gorge ESD, will join MESD in January, bringing expertise to enhance grant reporting and management.

7. Scholarship

a. No current updates or selections; discussions continue regarding fundraising and encouraging donations.

8. Governor's Budget Impact

- a. Potential reductions in SSA funding, particularly in technical assistance grants and STEM programs, are under review.
- b. Monitoring summer learning, early literacy, and High School Success fund allocations for impacts on MESD programs.
- c. Concerns raised about the Special Education Stipend Grant not covering payroll costs, potentially impacting district budgets.

9. Other Updates

- a. MESD is working to manage costs from the Special Education Stipend Grant by seeking efficiencies elsewhere.
- b. A comprehensive grant expenditure report is planned for future updates to the board.

10. Action Items

- a. Finalize financial statements and issue audit report by December 31.
- b. Coordinate January Finance Committee meeting for a detailed audit presentation.
- c. Continue monitoring budget impacts from state funding changes and strategize accordingly.
- d. Ensure updates and reports on PCEF and other grant-related activities are communicated effectively to stakeholders.

11. Adjourn

There being no further discussion, the meeting was adjourned at 2:45 p.m. The next meeting of the Finance Committee will take place on Thursday, January 19 at 1:30 p.m.
