### Summer School

We are already in our third week of summer school activities. Summer Saunters kicked off our programming by taking our students into the woods for hiking, exploring, writing, and reflection. 60 students participated in this week-long event. Our June summer school session has students participating in a number of activities, such as kayaking, biking, fishing and cooking. Students are genuinely excited about the various opportunities they have. We will average approximately 160 students throughout the four week June session.

Looking ahead, our July session will focus on swimming lessons and outdoor activities, with 152 students already registered! Additionally, this year we have added some day trip opportunities in late July/early August to places such as the Duluth aquarium, MN Science Museum and Como Zoo. We are excited to offer these new opportunities and thrilled that so many students are taking advantage! So far our registration numbers indicate we will average 95 students per trip!



Our jump start days on August 29, 30, 31 offer more of these outstanding opportunities and we hope all our students will take advantage!

Summer school continues to be an integral part of our educational programming. Each year we tweak our offerings just enough to keep students excited about unique learning opportunities. We want to keep summer school fresh for the students, and thanks to our staff who have worked so hard to create balance, students are attending summer school, but not giving up their summer.

### Frederic Elementary Recognized

The Elementary School has been recognized by the Wisconsin Rtl Center at the bronze level in math and reading. This means the school is recognized for full implementation/fidelity in the content areas at the universal level (tier 1) for at least one year. Further recognition at another level will require continued efforts with tier 1 and implementation of tier 2 and 3 supports over time.

### Food Service Meal Program

The U.S. Department of Agriculture will continue reimbursing schools for free meals to all students regardless of their income. This program will continue through the summer of 2022. The program's success has been built on ensuring that school aged children do not go hungry and have access to nutritious breakfast and lunch meals.

The free meal program is expected to stop after this summer due to the elimination of federal funding. Families will need to plan accordingly, as this program's retirement will bring us back to the traditional free and reduced lunch application process.
