Beeville ISD Board Report on Title I, Part A: Qualifications for Teachers and Paraprofessionals Required by the No Child Left Behind (NCLB) Act of 2001

Board/Public Hearing Report January 20, 2015

The No Child Left Behind Act or NCLB Act of 2001 requires that school districts receiving federal funds have 100% of their teachers who teach core academic classes classified as Highly Qualified. The core academic classes under NCLB include: ELA, Math, Science, Social Studies, Fine Arts, Foreign Language, and CTE courses that are accepted for graduation credit.

In order for a teacher to be classified as Highly Qualified, the teacher must:

- Hold a full Texas teacher certification; and
- Hold a minimum of a bachelor's degree; and
- Demonstrate subject area competency in each of the academic subjects in which the teacher teaches
