As I write this newsletter, it is important to reflect on a few things as November is upon us. I am excited with where we are as a school and our fall business is going well. Student accountability in every form is at the forefront of what we do here at HVHS. We have increased supervision in the parking lot and outside of our school in an attempt to improve the number of students leaving campus without permission. This coupled with the weekly Synervoice messages around unexcused absences or tardies has created some great conversations with parents and students. Attendance is the number one variable that is directly linked to graduation. It is my hope that there are conversations around the dinner table concerning attendance and the importance of it. If you get a call, and you are not aware of where your son/daughter is, please call the school for clarification so we can work together to find you child and hold them accountable.

HVHS has improved the way we do business with students in the hallway. As you visit our school, you might notice students using a note to go anywhere within our building during class time. We have significantly tightened this up and it is evident by the number of students in the hallway during class. Time spent out of class is time that students are not learning. Our staff and students have done a nice job with this expectation that should have tangible results.

We are constantly being proactive with negative behavior as a school. We have seen a decrease in negative behavior at the start of the year when compared to previous years. It is our hope that this continues as we recognize and teach expectations using Positive Behavior Intervention Supports. This program recognizes the good and not just the bad when we have student discipline situations that arise. PBIS principals focus on changing behavior in a pro-active manner rather than merely disciplining it. This does not mean that there aren't consequences- but we take everything into account based on the 20,000 foot view of what is best for each individual student.

Proficiency based learning in the classroom is moving the right direction with new conversations around rigor and creativity and the role that both have on student achievement. Currently, much of our time on Professional Development Fridays will be spent on how to systematically improve rigor by planning with creativity. We will continue to adjust and improve student engagement by how we deliver the curriculum in such a manner that it promotes expansion of thought. Creativity and open ended project based assessment will help promote this as a school. As we move forward with proficiency education we are excited to watch the progression of student learning happening in our classrooms as we move closer to individualized education in a traditional classroom setting.

As noted above, students have lots of opportunities that lend well with accountability. These are just a few that help define us as a school and educational communityJ.







'Stangs lock up second with W over arch rivals


