
Manufacturing Day-October 2019 Survey Results



Cyberpatriot Competition

THE NATIONAL YOUTH CYBER DEFENSE COMPETITION

At the center of CyberPatriot is the National Youth Cyber Defense Competition, which puts teams of high school and middle school students in the position of newly hired IT professionals tasked with managing the network of a small company. Through a series of online competition rounds, teams are given a set of virtual operating systems and are tasked with finding and fixing cybersecurity vulnerabilities while maintaining critical services. The top teams in the nation earn all-expenses-paid trips to Maryland for the National Finals Competition where they can earn national recognition and scholarship money.

Engineering and Welding hold Advisory Meeting

Discussion points:

1. Continue to work on soft skills (success skills, HCAAP). Develop credential for Success Skills attainment, which would signify achieving above average ratings on identified soft skills and then allowing students to complete the credential the latter part of their senior year. This completion would include an attendance requirement, talent portfolio and interview process with local businesses. After successful completion of the requirements, students would be able to submit their credential along with applications to county business/industry (that have signed on to the process). This will allow business and industry to quickly recognize those that are applying for positions as individuals that have a great work ethic.

2. Business/Industry would like to see Engineering and Welding do cross-training activities with their students. Blueprint reading and fabrication are areas of need.

3. CNC machining, manual lathe and manual milling machines need to come back into the training process. Advanced manufacturing training would be a great asset to business/industry in HIIsdale County. Discussed the Litchfield training facility and how we could use this as a training rotation for engineering and welding students. Businesses would provide the machines and training?

4. HR representatives would like to see students participate in mock interviews. They are willing to come and speak with kids about resumes, interview skills, filling out an application, etc.
