### **Behavior:**

\*In May, 87% of our students were referral free. April had 80% of our students referral free. Overall, our building had 645 referrals this year, which is a slight decrease from 2023-2024's 655 referrals. Our MTSS Team has asked staff to consistently write referrals for minor and major behaviors to clearly track behavior data. This allows us to see criteria including time, location, types of behavior, reasons for behavior, etc. which allows us problem solve and create incentives and interventions for individual students and/or groups of students.
