## **Purpose of Report:**

The purpose of this report is to provide the Board of Education information regarding the resources the core instruction department is requesting for disposal. We ask that the Board of Education approve the following:

 Library books that are outdated and in poor condition at <u>Horace Mann Elementary School</u> and <u>Percy L. Julian Middle School</u>

## The Process

The process for disposing of District property (library books and curricular resources) that are no longer needed for school purposes is provided below.

- Teacher identifies the library books or curricular resources that are damaged or no longer utilized to support student learning.
- Teacher completes the Curriculum Disposal Request form and submits the form and itemized list of library books or curricular resources to the principal for approval.
- Senior Director of Teaching and Learning reviews the Curriculum Disposal Request form and itemized list of library books or curricular resources and submits the request for items to be donated or recycled to the Board of Education, Superintendent, and Assistant Superintendent of Finance and Operations (copied).
- Principal is notified upon Board of Education approval. The school separates the library books
  or curricular resources based on items for donation and recycling. Damaged materials are
  recycled and the remaining materials are donated to SCARCE or to an organization in Africa
  that is responsible for the cost of shipping.

•	School contacts Buildings and Grounds for item pick up by entering a request into School Dude after final Board of Education approval.
