Purpose or Goal

To enhance student learning through contextual instruction, leadership and personal development, applied learning and real world application.

Prior knowledge

There will be a requirement of fundamental knowledge of welding. Including welding terminology, weld design, welding safety, electrical theory, the weldability of metals, and welding quality control. Students will be provided a short survey proving they understand the rudimentary information. Students will be required to provide a clean weld for the CTSO appointed sponsor. This information will be kept in member profiles alphabetically ordered and confidential.

Responsibilities

The responsibilities of members include to follow instruction, partake in holding meetings, elect club members for positions, enhancing skills, complete parent consent forms.
