<u>5th Grade</u>

ELAR students are working on Greek and Latin roots, drawing conclusions, compare & contrast, and persuasive writing.

Science classes have been working on energy resources. They have been talking about the formation of rocks, primarily sedimentary, along with the fossil fuels (coal, oil & natural gas). They have been discussing alternative energy sources such as wind, waves, solar, hydroelectric, geothermal and biofuels. They are moving into weathering, erosion, and deposition and how different land forms such as sand dunes, canyons, and deltas are created.

Math classes are working on mastering their skills at multiplying, dividing, and simplifying fractions.
