

Articulation Agreement and Instruction Contract
for the
Cosmetology Program
between
Odessa College
and
The Ector County Independent School District

The purpose of the Odessa College Cosmetology Program (hereinafter called “Program”) is to provide a curriculum for cosmetology students beginning in their **Junior** year in high school and continuing through their **Senior** year at Odessa College.

The following articulation agreement and instruction contract between Odessa College (hereinafter called “College”) and The Ector County Independent School District (hereinafter called “ISD”) will give Program students eight credits in high school cosmetology courses, as well as the opportunity to attend and pass the Cosmetology Operator’s licensure exam from the State Board of Cosmetology. Also, Program students will be awarded 41 semester credit hours in Cosmetology from Odessa College as may, at their option, continue on with advanced academic and workplace coursework to attain the Associate’s in Applied Science Degree in Cosmetology.

To provide a smooth transition for Program students from the Ector County Career Center as well as other high school campus sites (hereinafter called “schools”) to the College, and to eliminate duplication of coursework, the College and ISD agree as follows:

The ISD agrees to:

1. **Provide and maintain all Junior and Senior level courses on the ECISD Dual Credit inventory listed as “High School Credit for College Courses.” These courses and credits awarded are:**
 - a. CSMT 12568101, Cosmetology I (3 Credits)
 - b. CSMT2 12568102, Cosmetology II (3 Credits)
2. Furnish the College with an official copy of the following documents for each student enrolled in the Program:
 - a. High School transcript
 - b. Properly executed Dual Credit Form
3. **FOR JUNIOR AND SENIOR STUDENTS:**
Provide for an annual payment not to exceed \$868 per Program student per year to the College for:
 - a. Contract cosmetology instructor services, facilities, equipment, and utility costs for all Program students during their **Junior and Senior year**,
 - b. Trip expenses for the State Board of Licensure Exam
 - c. Tuition and fee reimbursement for CSME 1401, CSME 1443, CSME 1451, CSME 1405, CSME 1453, CSME 2401, and CSME 2441.
4. Provide transportation to and from the College for all Program students.

The College agrees to:

1. Provide a college instructor for all Program students.
2. Provide all lecture and lab facilities, utilities, and equipment.
3. Provide sponsored trips to the District and State SkillsUSA competition for eligible Junior and Senior Program students.
4. Provide a sponsored trip to the site of the State Board Licensure Exam for all eligible Senior Program Students.
5. Grant credit for CSME 1447, and CSME 2343 for successful completion of CSME 2441 and high school graduation. The 11 semester credit hours in CSME 1447, CMSE 2439, and CSME 2343 will be held in escrow and be placed on the student's transcripts with the successful completion of CSME 2441 and graduation from ISD.
6. Provide instruction in:
 - a. CSME 1401, Orientation to Cosmetology
 - b. CSME 1443, Manicuring and Related Theory
 - c. CSME 1451, Artistry of Hair Theory & Practice
 - d. CSME 1405, Fundamentals of Cosmetology
 - e. CSME 1453, Chemical Reformation & Related Theory
 - f. CSME 2401, Principles of Hair Coloring and Related Theory
 - g. CSME 2441, Preparation for the State Licensing Examinationwithout further tuition and/or College fee expenses to Program students.
7. Provide the ISD with an accurate attendance report for Program students.

This agreement shall become effective as of **October 17, 2007**, and shall remain in effect, on a year by year basis, until its termination. This agreement may be terminated at the end of any academic year by either party by giving at least a one semester notice to the other party.
